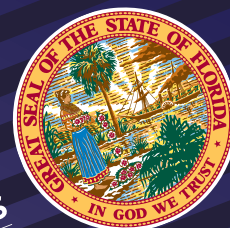

DAY ONE - Saturday, December 2

90-Year Old Swimmers Turn in Record Performances and Bowler Rolls Perfect Game at Florida Senior Games Day One

Day One of the 2017 Florida Senior Games featured memorable performances by athletes in the 90+ age groups, record-setting times and scores in the swimming pool and on bowling lanes and a gold medal winning effort by a volleyball team playing together for the first time.

Over 2,000 athletes are competing in the 26th Annual Florida Senior Games in Clearwater and Pinellas County, through December 10, and on day one, eight sports were in action.

Of the 24 swimming age group records broken at The Long Center Pool Saturday, six were set by swimmers in the 90-94 age group. Betty Lorenzi, of Lake Geneva, Wisconsin, topped the U.S. Masters Swimming 100 yard backstroke national record by 20 seconds with a time of 1:54.60. She also holds the 100 yard back U.S. Masters Swimming national records in the 80-84 and 85-89 age groups. She bested the previous 90-94 age group Florida Senior Games record by a minute and a half. Lorenzi also established a Florida Senior Games 200 yard backstroke record in the 90-94 age group.

Jean Troy, of Sun City Center, set 90-94 age group records in the 100 breaststroke and 200 freestyle and John Cornell, of Lady Lake, set records in the 100 back and 100 breaststroke.

In Mixed Doubles Bowling at Seminole Lanes, Gregory Lindsay, of North Fort Myers, rolled the fifth perfect game in the history of the Florida Senior Games. After a 185 and 231 game with his partner Joanne Herman, of Seminole, Lindsay rolled 12 consecutive strikes for the 300 game. Lindsay and Herman's combined score of 1241 was good for a silver medal in the 55-59 age group.

Prior to rolling his perfect game, Lindsay was part of a record-setting men's doubles effort with Jerry Lake, of Cape Coral. The duo combined for a score of 1439, beating the previous 50-54 age group record by 131 pins. Lake had a three-game score of 752 while Lindsay had a 687.

In women's doubles, Carol Teel, of The Villages, and Cristy Morawski, of Milton, set a new all-time best women's doubles score with a 1392 and a new record in the 60-64 age group. The previous best women's doubles score was 1302 and the previous best 60-64 age group record was set by Teel and Mary Chamberlin, a 1224, in 2016. Morawski's three game score of 783 was the highest of all bowlers on Saturday.

Robert Greene and Bruce Silvey, of St. Petersburg, set a new men's doubles record in the 80-84 age group with a combined score of 1168. The previous record was 1154.



The Palm Harbor Spikers won the Men's 50+ Volleyball gold medal defeating The Ref Shop, of Madiera Beach, a team that has won gold medals in three of the last four years. The Spikers lost to the Ref Shop in pool play but advanced to the gold medal game and avenged the earlier loss.

After dropping the first game 25-19, the Spikers won game two 25-23 and came from behind to win game three 15-12. In the deciding game, the Ref Shop took an early lead but the Spikers stormed back to take a lead and hold it.

"Mike Knorowski got hot on the serve and scored five straight points," said Daniel Perez, the team captain.

Members of the Spikers team have played on various teams in Senior Games events but came together for the first time as a team at the 2017 Games. The team includes Daniel Perez, of Palm Harbor; Jamie Feliciano and Mike Knorowski, of Wesley Chapel; Arben Marleci and Kenneth Hayes, of Clearwater; Nelson Matos, of Largo; James Huber, of The Villages; Bruce Benz and Jim Jantze.

“We played very well for a team getting together for the first time,” said Perez. “And we beat a really good team for the gold medal.”

The Archery competition at the Joe Dimaggio Sports Complex featured two impressive records being set. Tim Walker, of North Fort Myers, established a new all-time high score in the Recurve event, shooting an 834 to win the gold medal in the 55-59 age group. He topped the previous all-time high score and 55-59 age group record by 38 points, set by Jeffrey Wiseman, of The Villages, in 2007. It is the first 800 score in the event in Florida Senior Games history.

John Horwath, the 2016 Florida Senior Games Male Athlete of the Year, from The Villages, became the first archery athlete in the history of the Games to compete in the 95-99 age group. He established the age group record in the Compound & Release event shooting a 789. He also holds the 90-94 Compound & Release age group record and three age group records (80+, 85+, 90+) in the Compound & Finger event.

The overall high score was shot by James Harden, of Ocala, an 872 (of a possible 900) in the Compound & Release event to win the gold medal in the 55-59 age group. The overall highest women’s score was turned in by Joyce Haniman, of Fort Pierce, an 826, to win the Compound & Release 50-54 age group gold medal.

At the Clearwater Lawn Bowls and Shuffleboard Complex, Henry and Linda Armstrong, of Woodslee, Ontario and Lakeland, continue to be the most prolific Florida Senior Games shuffleboard players in the history of the Games. They each won their ninth singles gold medal, dating back to 2005 for Henry and 2007 for Linda. This year’s gold came in the 65-69 age group for both.

The 2017 Games most experienced athlete, 96-year old Paul Allaire, of Clearwater, won a gold medal in the 95-99 age group. He is one of only five shuffleboard players to compete in the 90+ age groups in the 26 years of the Florida Senior Games. He will play doubles on Sunday with his partner Pete Desjardins, of Safety Harbor.

Tai Chi, now in its second year in the Florida Senior Games, feature a variety of forms and push hands competitions.



David Wong Yee, of Clearwater, won three gold medals and a silver and recorded three of the highest forms scores of the day. Yee, a clinical herbalist and acupuncturist, scored a 9.2 of a possible 10 points in his gold medal-winning Advanced Hand Forms, Advanced Sword and Advanced Other Weapons events. He also won a bronze medal in push hands.

Janet Montague, of Bradenton, won gold medals in the Advanced Sword and Advance Other weapons and has won five gold medals in two years of Florida Senior Games Tai Chi competition. St. Petersburg’s Andrew Walker moved up to the Advanced Push Hands Division and defeated the 2016 Advanced Gold Medalist, Sam Winters, for the championship. Walker, who won the Beginner Division Push Hands in 2016, also defeated Charles Boardman en route to the gold medal.

Day Two of the 2017 features action in six sports as Racquetball, Bowling, Volleyball, Shuffle board, Swimming come to an end. Men’s and Women’s Singles Tennis will also conclude, but Tennis continues through December 7.

DAY TWO – SUNDAY, December 3, 2017

80+ Year Old Florida Senior Games Swimmers Continue to Break Records

Florida Senior Games swimmers, age 80 and over, continued their assault on the Games record book Sunday. Of the 24 age group records broken at The Long Center in Clearwater, eight were broken by swimmers in the 80-84, 85-89 and 90-94 age group.

Over 2,000 athletes are competing in the 26th Annual Florida Senior Games in Clearwater and Pinellas County, through December 10, and on day two, six sports were in action.



John Cornell, of Lady Lake, finished his two days of swimming with five new records in the 90-94 age group. On Sunday, he became the age group record holder for the 50 and 100 yard freestyle and 50 backstroke. Betty Lorenzi, of Lake Geneva, Wisconsin (*at left*), added two more records in the 90-94 age group and set a new 50 backstroke record, topping the previous by over 40 seconds. She also set a 100 freestyle record.

Charlie Weatherbee, of Clermont, set a new 200 IM record in the 85-89 age group with a time of 4:29.60, more than 1:35 faster than the record set in 2005 by Howard Hall. Patricia Tullman, of Valrico, set 80-84 age group records in the 50 yard freestyle and 200 yard butterfly.

In Men's and Women's Singles Bowling, a pair of northwest Florida bowlers had the highest scores of the day. John Israel, of Pensacola, rolled a three-game score of 758 (255, 269, 234) to claim the gold medal in the 70-74 age group. He was one of four men's singles bowlers, of the 73 competing to have a score of more than 700.

The high women's score was turned in by Cristy Morawski, of Milton, who won the 60-64 age group gold medal with a 714. Her second game score of 278 was the best single game score of the day. She won two gold medals on Saturday, teaming with Carol Teel, of The Villages, for a women's doubles gold and record-setting score in the 60-64 age group and Robert Veit, of Pensacola, in 55-59 age group mixed doubles.

Winning a pair of Shuffleboard gold medals over the weekend was Dave Dean, of The Villages, whose last Florida Senior Games appearance came on the tennis and pickleball courts. Dean won the men's single gold in the 80-84 age group on Saturday and teamed with Robert Brandt Sunday, to win a doubles gold medal.

Dean won Florida Senior Games Tennis and Pickleball gold medals in 75-79 age group in 2012. He turned to shuffleboard to keep his competitive juices flowing after major surgery on his foot and ankle two years ago.

"I can't run well so I had to give up racquet sports," said Dean. "I took up shuffleboard and have been doing very well with it, especially with my partner in doubles."

Larry Ardito, of Bonita Springs, won his fourth Racquetball gold medal in five years at the Richey Racquet Club in Port Richey, winning the 65-69 age group. He has also won a total of six men's singles gold medals since 2009. Ardito beat Roger O'Connor, of Citrus Springs, in the gold medal match 15-10, 15-10 and won a total of four singles matches. He also paired with Lucy Ramsay, of Naples, to win the 65-69 mixed doubles gold medal. The duo won 65-69 mixed doubles gold medal at the 2017 National Senior Games.

Winning four matches in two days of Men's Singles Tennis, Gabriel Wong, of Ponte Vedra Beach, took the gold medal in the 70-74 age group. He defeated Bruce Wyse in the championship match 6-1, 6-3. Wong returns to the court on Thursday to play men's singles pickleball in the 70-74 age group.

In an interesting way to compete in the Florida Senior Games women's volleyball, the Beaches team defeated the Florida Girls, for the 50-54 age group gold medal.



The two teams are actually a collection of 20 women's volleyball players that are divided up into teams based on their availability for tournament play, according to team organizer Susie Williamson, of Edgewater, who played collegiate volleyball and basketball at Stetson University. Williamson's Beaches team came up on the short end of a 25-18, winner take all game for the gold medal, against the Florida Girls led by Sandy Garner, of Daytona Beach, who played collegiate volleyball at the University of Memphis and was the girl's volleyball coach at Daytona Beach Mainland High School.

'We send out emails to the 20 players to find out if they can play at tournaments,' said Williamson. "Then Sandy and I divide up the teams by the level of skill. We had 13 of the 20 playing today."

The Beaches team consisted of Sandy Smaltz, Sandy Garner, Wendy Warfield, Teri Male, Cara Swayze and Lisa Huntley *(in order left to right in photo above)*.

In the 60-64 age group, the Vintage Volleys team, from The Villages, defeated the Vintage Volleys Senior Team, in three games for the gold medal. After dropping game one 25-13, the Junior Volleys won the next two games 25-22 and 15-5. The gold medal winning Vintage Volleys team is made up of Terry Thomas, Heath Davenport, Mimi Morrill, Nanc Dumonz, Barbie Strome, Chris Pusch, Suzanne Vallario and Renie Curry.

After a full weekend, the 2017 Florida Senior Games continues Monday with two sports in action. The first day of Men's and Women's Doubles Tennis begins at Innisbrook Resort and Golf Club and Table Tennis begins its first day of competition at The Long Center with the 50-69 age groups in action.

Two FSG Table Tennis Players Complete 3-Event Gold Medal Sweep

Jacksonville Table Tennis player Winston Dowridge has been competing in the Florida Senior Games for three years and in each of the three years he has increased his gold medal total.



The retired Navy veteran, won gold medals in all three events Monday at The Long Center in Clearwater as the gymnasium was filled to capacity with 20 tables. Dowridge (pictured at left) won the Men's Singles 55-59 age group for the second consecutive year. He teamed with Eric Penny to win the 55-59 Men's Doubles gold and with Juliana Milanov, of Winter Garden, to win 50-54 Mixed Doubles.

In the 2016 Games, he won gold medals in Men's Singles 55-59 age group and the 50-54 Men's Doubles and in 2015, he won the Mixed Doubles 50-54 age group gold medal.

With three gold medals hanging around his neck, after winning a total of eight matches Monday, Dowridge admits he enjoys the competition and winning gold medals, but the camaraderie plays a big part in his affection for the Florida Senior Games and table tennis.

"I spent my career in the Navy traveling to different bases," he said. "Playing in table tennis tournaments in the Senior Games and other outlets continues to give athletes a chance to travel and opens your eyes to a whole different world out there."

Also feeling the weight of three gold medals around their neck was William Lee, of Orlando. Lee won the 65-69 age group Men's Singles and Men's Doubles gold and the Mixed Doubles gold with Patricia Benitiz, in the 55-59 age group.

To win the men's doubles gold medal, Lee and his partner, John Reynolds, of Palm Harbor, had to withstand a five-game challenge from Stuart Lesser and William Mogensen, of The Villages. On the verge of a four-game victory with a 10-8 lead, Lee and Reynolds gave up four straight points to even the match at two games each. The duo rebounded to win game five 11-6, denying Lesser and Mogensen a second consecutive gold medal in the men's doubles 65-69 age group.

While Patricia Benitiz teamed with Lee to win the mixed doubles gold medal, she also won her fourth consecutive women's singles gold medal and sixth in the last seven years. Since 2010, Benitiz has won a combined 12 gold medals in women's singles and mixed doubles.

Table Tennis continues Tuesday at the Long Center with athletes age 70 and over on the floor, while Men's and Women's Doubles Tennis continues at the Innisbrook Resort and Golf Course. Golf begins with 18-hole competition and the first day of 36-hole competition at the Countryside Country Club.

2017 Florida Senior Games Day Four Highlighted by Golf, Table Tennis and Tennis

Day Four of the 2017 Florida Senior Games found Table Tennis players on the Long Center Gym floor for their final day of swinging their paddles. Men's and Women's Doubles Tennis players were on the courts for the final day of swinging their racquets at Innisbrook Resort and Golf Club.



Meanwhile, at the Countryside Country Club, Men's and Women's golfers hit the links for the first of two days swinging their clubs. A group of golfers played their 18-hole round while others played day one of their 36-hole competition.

Golfers began teeing off at 8:00 a.m., but the final tee time of the day belonged to the elder statesmen of the day. 90-year old Charles Madge (left in photo), of Altamonte Springs, and 93-year old Charles Miller (right in photo), of Sebring, approached the first tee at 9:48, with quite an audience in tow.

Seven members of Miller's family, who deemed themselves, "Charlie's Army," followed in golf carts for all 18 holes. Charlie's Army included his wife, Yvette, four of his children and a couple of their spouses, who traveled from Indiana and Texas.

"They don't usually come out to the golf course and follow me," Miller said with a laugh. "It was quite a bit of pressure for about 17 holes."

The two Charlie's, arrived back at the clubhouse around 3:00 p.m. with Charlie Madge turning in a score of 96 and Charlie Miller recording a 101. Miller returns on Wednesday to complete his 36-hole competition.

Madge was recently named as a Humana Game Changer, for exemplifying healthy aging and providing encouragement, motivation and inspiration for all seniors to stay healthy.

In the 18-hole competition, Lisa Hartley, of Tampa, shot an 84 to win her fifth consecutive gold medal. Her 2017 medal-winning performance came in the 70-74 age group. The native of Portsmouth, New Hampshire has been playing golf since the age of 12, when she grew up near a golf course. She and her curious brother would venture on the course where they learned the game.

Hartley's 84 was tied for the lowest women's score of the day along with Judy Stillman, of The Villages. Stillman returns Wednesday to wrap up the 36-hole competition, with a three-stroke lead over Lakeland's Janet Brown, the 2015 Florida Senior Games Female Athlete of the Year, in the 65-69 age group.

The lowest men's score of the day was recorded by Rick Butler, a 73, in the men's 55-59 age group. Butler returns Wednesday with a 10-stroke lead over the nearest competition in his age group going into the second day of golf.



As the Florida Senior Games annual number increases, so does John Shultz's consecutive years medal winning streak. The Inverness table tennis player climbed upon the medal stand for the 25th consecutive year, the longest consecutive years medal winning streak among all athletes. Shultz (pictured at left) won the 80-84 age group men's singles and teamed with Deane Chickering, of The Villages for the men's doubles gold. He won a silver medal in the 75-79 age group with Sylvia Longley, of Crystal River.

Hyae Yeon Churchill, of Ocala, had a gold medal sweep in all three events winning the 70-74 age group women's singles, doubles and mixed doubles events. In the mixed doubles win, she paired with Dave Brooks to defeat the husband and wife team of Newton and Don Tran, from Clearwater. The two mixed doubles teams squared off in the gold medal match in 2016 with the Tran's taking the gold medal.

Churchill and Brooks (in photo below) have lived in the same Ocala neighborhood for 20 years and are members of the Ocala Table Tennis Club. They have been in the 70-74 mixed doubles championship match for each of the last three years and won the gold medal in 2015.

"When we started playing together, we were nobodies," said Churchill. "But we kept working at it. Now we have gold medals."

In women's singles play, Churchill won her third consecutive gold in the 70-74 age group and sixth since 2010. She teamed with Jane Pang, of Clermont, to win the 70-74 women's doubles gold, also her third consecutive in the age group.



Jay Bortner and Barry Shollenberger teamed to win their second consecutive men's doubles tennis gold medal Tuesday and third in four years in 70-74 age group. They defeated Toi Phan, of Brandon, and Ngon Nguyen, of Tampa, 6-3, 6-3, in the final. The pair also combined to win a gold medal at the 2017 National Senior Games in July. Bortner has won men's doubles medal every year since 2011, in the 70-74 and 65-69 age groups, and teamed with Shollenberger to win golds in 2010, 2014 and 2016.

The Villages Rick Butler Cards Lowest Florida Senior Games 36-Hole Score

Over two days of Florida Senior Games 36-hole golf competition, Rick Butler, of The Villages, was the only golfer to record back-to-back days of scores in the 70s. He shot a 73 on Tuesday and followed up with a 70 on Wednesday for a 143 to win the 55-59 age group gold medal and set a new 36-hole all-time best score.



His two day score of 143 bested the previous record by four strokes. Fellow golfer from The Villages, Nick Kent shot a 147 (75/72) over two days in 2015 in the 70-74 age group.

Butler's 70 is the lowest Florida Senior Games 18-hole total since Robert Cunningham, of St. Cloud, shot a 69 for a gold medal in the 60-64 age group. Besides Butler, only seven other golfers had scores in the 70s.

For his two under par score, with 35's both the front and back nine, Butler had five birdies on the day, including one on a 450-yard par five, and shot par on nine holes.

"I hit 13 or 14 greens today and didn't have any three putts," said Butler of his gold-medal winning performance. "I also chipped in from the fringe a couple of times.

Butler (pictured above with sport director Frank Anderson), who was The Villages 2017 Golf Champion, played golf at Gannon University, a Division II school in Erie, PA, where he earned All-America status in 1986.

Lakeland's Janet Brown (at right) won her 14th gold medal in the last 15 years with a two day total of 174, with back-to-back scores of 87. Brown entered the second round, three strokes behind Judy Stillman, of The Villages, who shot an 84 on Tuesday.

On the front nine, Brown cut Stillman's lead to one stroke with a 44 while Stillman had a 46. Brown shot a 43 on the back to Stillman's 50 for the gold medal.

The second day of mixed doubles wraps up six days of Tennis Thursday at the Innisbrook Resort and Golf Course. Judi and Aubrey Whitaker, of Lake Wales, will play for their fourth consecutive mixed doubles gold medal, this year in the 70-74 age group. The Whitaker's won the 65-69 mixed doubles gold from 2014-16 and a 60-64 age group gold medal in 2011. They face Mary Helen Fryman, of Cantonment, and Floyd Stevinson, of Pensacola in the finals at 9:00 a.m.



Day Six of Nine features three more sports in action as Pickleball begins four days of play with Men's and Women's Singles at The Long Center and the North Greenwood Recreation Center. The Cycling 5K and 10K Time Trials will be run at Fort DeSoto Park and Lawn Bowls will be held at the Clearwater Lawn Bowls and Shuffleboard Complex.

Cycling Time Trials Records Fall on Day at the Beach

Riding on a day at Fort DeSoto Park North Beach, with little to no wind, resulted in record times posted by Florida Senior Games Cyclists in the 5K and 10K Time Trials.

A total of 13 age group records were broken, nine by women's cyclists and four by men.

"This may be the best day for riding for record times I've ever seen at an event at Fort DeSoto Park," said Race Director, Felix Hernandez.



The 2016 Florida Senior Games Female Athlete of the Year, Kathy Petrillo, of Jupiter, became the first woman in the history of the Games to record a 5K time of under seven minutes and a 10K time under 15 minutes. Her 5K time of 6:50 was 43 seconds faster than her previous overall best of 7:38 in 2012. Her time of 14:07 in the 10K was 58 seconds better than her mark of 15:05 in 2012. Petrillo holds the 50-54 age groups and topped her own records in the 55-59 age groups set last year.

Besides the favorable conditions, Petrillo pointed out a couple of other reasons for her success today. ;'

"It's all in the training I do and I got some new gadgets on my bike," she said.

Also setting age group records were Dave and Louise Watts, who have a Florida residence in Clermont but hail from Elmvale, Ontario. Louise's time of 8:16 in the 5K time trials was 42 seconds faster than the previous record in the 70-74 age group set by Carol Jean Vosburgh, of St. Petersburg, in 2015. Dave's records were set in the 75-79 age group.

"I just love the opportunity to ride in the five-year age groups that the Senior Games offers," said Louis Watts. "In Canada, I have to ride against 40 and 50 year olds. It's wonderful to come out here and see 80 year olds riding at the levels they do."

80-year old Patricia Beam, of Calendonia, IL, set records in both events, topping the previous 5K mark by one minute and 14 seconds.

In Day One of Four in the Pickleball competition, Gabriel Wong, of Ponte Vedra Beach, advanced through the 10-player Men's Singles 70-74 age group bracket to win the gold medal. He defeated Samy Noori, of Dunedin, in the championship match, for his fourth win of the day. He also won a Men's Singles Tennis gold medal on Sunday, defeating four opponents in the 70-74 age group.



“I like both sports,” said Wong. “I’ve been playing tennis for 40 years and just picked up pickleball about two years ago.”

Doug Hastings, of Alexandria, VA, won four matches to advance through 65-69 bracket and win the gold medal. He defeated Robert Welter of Cape Coral, who won four consecutive men’s singles gold medals prior to this year, in three games. Hastings will compete in six track and field events on Saturday and Sunday.

Diane Bock, of The Villages, won her fourth pickleball women’s singles gold medal in six years winning the 60-64 age group.

In the final tennis match of six days of Florida Senior Games Tennis at the Innisbrook Resort and Golf Course, Judi and Aubrey Whitaker, of Lake Wales, won their fourth consecutive mixed doubles gold medal. They defeated , Mary Helen Fryman, of Cantonment, and Floyd Stevinson, of Pensacola in the 70-74 age group finals, 6-1, 6-1. The Whitaker’s won the 65-69 mixed doubles gold

from 2014-16 and a 60-64 age group gold medal in 2011.

Pat Beggs and Debbie Foster, of Bradenton, won the Lawn Bowls gold medal at the Clearwater Lawn Bowls and Shuffleboard Complex,, spoiling Clearwater’s Dave Murray and Art Allen in their attempt to “ThreePeat.” Murray and Allen, winners of the 2015 and 2016 gold medal, suffered an early round loss, and finished in fourth place among the 18 teams competing.

Pickleball Teammates become Opponents in Mixed Doubles Finals

A pair of gold medal winning Pickleball women's doubles players squared off in the mixed doubles finals in the final match of the day at The Long Center.



Sylvia Whitehouse, of Palm Coast (third from left in photo), and George Gamboa, of Elkton, defeated Erica Gonzalez (second from left in photo), of Poinciana, and Terri Billington, of Hernando, 11-6, 11-3, in the 50-54 age group finals. It was the second consecutive year Whitehouse won a FSG Mixed Doubles gold medal in the age group. Last year, playing with Archie Adams, of Fort Myers, they defeated Gonzalez and her partner in the finals.

Whitehouse and Gonzalez have teamed to win the 50-54 women's doubles age group the past two years. They were also gold medal winners at the 2017 National Senior Games, in Birmingham, in June.

"I have to be really careful when I play against her," said Whitehouse. "She's such a fierce competitor."

Winning their third consecutive Mixed Doubles gold medals were the teams of Lydia Willis and Gary Miller, of The Villages, in 55-59 age group and Bobbi Little, of North Fort Myers and Robert Welter, of Cape Coral, in the 60-64 age group.

At the Horseshoes competition at Ed C. Wright Park, in Clearwater, Carl Nordquist, of Haines City threw 40 ringers in the 90 horseshoes pitched to win a gold medal in the 80-84 age group. He won three matches in the age group round robin play.



The highest ringer percentage belonged to Charles "Buddy" Short, of Ocala, with 20 ringers in 30 pitches for a 66.7 percentage. He only played one match to win the 75-79 age group gold medal. The top female pitcher was Claudette Braswell, of Lake Wales, who threw 32 ringers in 60 shots for a 53.3 accuracy rate to win the 80-84 age group.

At the Nine-Ball Billiards competition, George West, of The Villages, won his third gold medal in a third different age group, dating back to the 2010 Games. He won a Nine-Ball gold in the 65-69 age group in 2010, in the 70-74 age group in 2013 and in the 75-79 age group this year.

78-Year Old Blind and Deaf Powerlifter Bench Presses over 150 lbs and Deadlifts over 200 lbs

It was a day of determination at the Florida Senior Games Saturday in Clearwater, as one athlete overcame a loss of sight and hearing to win medals while others overcame the elements of a cold and rainy day to set records.



78-year old FSG Powerlifter Bob Jardine, of Winter Haven, did not see the weights on the bar or hear the cheers of the crowd after he completed a 159 pound bench press and 209 pound deadlift. He lost his sight to Retinitis Pigmentosa and is completely deaf in one ear and only has 30% hearing in the other ear, with a hearing aid.

Jardine completed his lift with tap command from officials, letting him know when to start, press and rack. He also followed the same official's command to complete a 209 pound deadlift. Bob has been without sight and hearing for nearly 20 years and has been competing in USA Powerlifting events for the last

seven years.

The top powerlifters were Samuel Beckwith, of Lakeland, among the men's lifters and Sheryl Franklin, of Port Orange, for the women. Beckwith had the top totals of all men's competitors with a squat of 595 pounds, a bench press of 451 pounds and a deadlift of 606 pounds, a total of 1653 pounds. Franklin, a math teacher at New Smyrna Beach High School, had the top women's totals with a squat of 176 pounds, a bench press of 137 pounds and a deadlift of 281 pounds. She established a new personal best in the deadlift, surpassing her previous best of 250 pounds, by 31 pounds.



As the rain fell on the field events of the Track and Field competition, a strong wind blew in from the north across the track at Dunedin High School. With the 20 mph wind at his back, Rodney Atherton, of Tallahassee (at left), took off for the bar and cleared a record-breaking high jump of 5 feet, 2 inches, in the 60-64 age group. Atherton broke his own record of 5 feet, 0 inches he set last year. Atherton attempted a jump of 5 feet 3 inches, but was unsuccessful.

Among the athletes braving the elements to throw, Tiny Cazal, of The Villages, added her name to another age group with a discus throw of 52 feet breaking the previous record by 16 feet. She set the 70-74 age group record in 2007 and the 75-79 record in 2012. She now holds a total of seven field event records in the javelin, discus, shot put and long jump.

By winning gold medals in the Cycling 20K and 40K Road Race, Patricia Beam, of Caledonia, IL and Carl Westergren, of Jacksonville, completed gold medal sweeps of all four FSG Cycling events, Beam winning in the 80-84 age group and Westergren in the 60-64 age group. Besides the gold medal performances, Beam also turned in record-breaking time in the Time Trials events on Thursday.

Longtime FSG Basketball player, Harry Carothers, of Pinellas Park was the only men's Basketball Shooter to win the Free Throw, Spot Shooting and Timed Field Goal Shooting events, in age groups with more than one entrant.

Carothers hit 28 of 30 free throws, the second highest total of all shooters, behind the 29 made by Garland Reynolds. He hit 14 of 15 shots in the Spot Shooting event, tied for the top total of all shooters with Jerry Layton, of Spring Hill and Reynolds. He had 94 points in the Timed Field Goal Shooting, hitting 21 three-point shots in one minute.

Chris Evans, of The Villages, was the top overall women's shooter in two of three events. She hit 27 of 30 free throws, hit 11 of 15 shots in the Spot Shooting to win the 60-64 age group gold medals.

The Bucketmakers Men's 65-69 age group 3-on-3 Basketball team came all the way from Dakota Dunes, South Dakota to win the gold medal. The Bucketmakers won three games in pool play and defeated the Venice Lime 54-48 in the Championship Game. Neal Westbury led the Bucketmakers in the Championship Game with 28 points.



Paul Hodge, of Tallahassee, (at left) was the top overall finisher in the 5K Road Race, crossing the finish line with a time of 18:43 to win the 55-59 age group gold medal. Hodge finished nearly two minutes ahead of the overall second place runner, Mickey Hooke, of Bradenton, who ran the overall fastest time in Games history with a 17:24 in 2012. The overall top women's finisher was Mirna Castrejon, of Summerfield, who ran the 3.1 mile course in 23:19 to win the 60-64 age group gold medal.

The top Race Walker was Karl Hughes, of Seminole, with a time of 30:49 to win the 55-59 age group gold medal and Rick Cervis, of Tampa, had the top Power Walk time of 33:23.

A day after meeting in the Mixed Doubles 50-54 age group championship game as opponents, Erica Gonzalez and Sylvia Whitehouse teamed together to win their third consecutive Women's Doubles gold medal. The duo won four matches defeating Jana Spano and Lydia Willis in the Championship Match.

Also winning their third consecutive Women's Doubles gold medal was Bobbi Little, of North Fort Myers, and Diane Bock, of The Villages, in the 60-64 age group and Gary Miller, of The Villages, and Steve Wojcik, of Downer's Grove, IL, in the Men's Doubles 60-64 age group.

Doug Cotton, of Seffner, won his second gold medal of Billiards competition, winning the 50-54 age group in both 8-ball and 9-Ball. Cotton also competed in the 5K Race Walk prior to Billiards, but was disqualified.

2017 Florida Senior Games Comes to a Close

The 2017 Florida Senior Games came to a close at 4:54 p.m. Sunday when Craig Brown, of Seminole, and Dean Refakes, of St. Petersburg, won the Men's Doubles Pickleball gold medal game in the 70-74 age group at The Long Center.



The gold medal for Refakes comes almost three years after suffering a heart attack on a Fort Myers Beach Pickleball court. Refakes "flatlined," before being brought back to life by an automatic external defibrillator (AED) that was present at the Indian Creek RV Park.

"There were four or five guys also playing that day and they jumped into action," Refakes said. "Also across the street playing miniature golf with his family was a volunteer fireman, who literally jumped a fence to come and help. He was the one who actually shocked me. He said afterwards it was the first time he had used one of those things when it brought someone back to life."

Their win brought four days of Pickleball and nine days of the 26th Annual Florida Senior Games to an official end.

The most experienced female athlete of the 2017 Games took to the starting line for the 50 and 100 meter dash Sunday in the running events of the Track and Field competition. 95-year old Mary Kemp, of Boca Raton, established a 50 meter dash record with her time of 23.60, as the first athlete to run in the age group. She also completed the 100 meter dash in 50.63.



Kemp was in Clearwater with her son, Glenn, from Fairhope, AL, who won a 3-on-3 Basketball gold medal with his Alabama-based, Code Blue team, in the 70-74 age group.

Dressed in a strawberry red-colored collared shirt, red swirly tights and fluorescent green running shoes, Kemp was greeted with hugs by the five other runners in her 50 meter dash heat. With the early morning chilly temperatures, she bounced around on the Dunedin High School football field following her run.

"I'm not dancing," she proclaimed. "I'm just trying to stay warm."

Only two other records were broken at the running events of the Track and Field meet Sunday at Dunedin High School, both in the 50 meter dash. Madelaine "Tiny" Cazel, of The Villages, ran a 10.27, to set an 80-84 age group record and Raymond Jansco, also from The Villages, ran a 7.93 in the

75-79 age group.

Michael Devaney, of Globe, Arizona, won the 1500 meter Race Walk 65-69 age group gold medal with the fastest overall men's time of 9:57.15. Devaney has been on a three-year goal to compete in every state Senior Games affiliated with NSGA.

"I only have two more states to go," said Devaney. "I've already been to these Florida games two years ago and won the 1500 race walk. I enjoy going back when I can to a state where I had a good time before."

For the fifth consecutive year, Robert Welter, of Cape Coral, has played in the championship matches of all three FSG Pickleball events. Every year, he has come up short in one event to win two gold medals and a silver. For the last two years, an out-of-state participant has been his nemesis.

“Yeah, that’s something, isn’t it,” he said with a laugh at the conclusion of men’s doubles competition. “I’m going to have to do something about that, start cutting some tires maybe. But that’s what it’s all about, playing against other good players.”

This year, he lost the men’s singles championship match to Doug Hastings, of Alexandria, VA. The last two years it was a men’s doubles loss against a team with an out of state player, Steve Wojcik, of Downer’s Grove, IL, along with Gary Miller, of The Villages. Miller and Wojcik again teamed this year to win the 60-64 men’s doubles gold for the third consecutive year. All of Welter’s medals this year came in the 65-69 age group.

The 2018 Florida Senior Games returns to Clearwater and Pinellas County for the fourth year of a four-year commitment, December 1-9, 2018. See www.floridaseniorgames.com for 2018 Florida Senior Games Series Qualifiers that begin in January.

Cape Coral elite pickleball player keeps winning, promotes sport

Mike Welter would be well qualified to give an annual report on the state of pickleball in Lee County and even expand on his personal accomplishments in 2017.

The 65-year-old Cape Coral elite pickleball tournament player is relentless in promoting the popular sport while collecting his own championship trophies.

"It was a good year for me, maybe my best ever, and I hate to see it end," Welter said. "I like to play so I keep busy.

"As long as my body holds up I'll be fine. I retired from the Marines 17 years ago and I still feel the same today physically. My uniform still fits."

Welter teamed with Glenn Geda of Michigan to finish second in men's doubles in the National Senior Games in Birmingham, Alabama, and eighth in singles. He qualified after winning three gold medals in the Lee County Senior Games and two gold and a silver medal in the Florida Senior Games.

Welter followed by winning the singles gold medal in the men's 65-69 category in the Seniors International Pickleball Association's World Championships in Griffin, Georgia, in October. He also teamed with Bobbi Little of North Fort Myers to win the mixed doubles.

"It can take a toll on you playing a lot of matches in a short amount of time, so you better be in shape," he said. "The silver medal in Birmingham was special because it happened on my birthday."

Welter has won two national seniors singles titles.

Another discussion centers on Welter's desires to see the sport grow in Southwest Florida with more pickleball courts available.

"We don't have one pickleball court in Cape Coral and that flusters me," he said. "They're elsewhere – North Fort Myers, south Fort Myers and Estero. A lot of people are playing the sport and for example, around 60 people show up every Monday and Thursday at 7 a.m. in North Fort Myers to use the four courts and a lot of the players are from Cape Coral."

The U.S. Open Pickleball Championships are played annually in Naples in late April. More than 1,000 players entered in 2017 including new convert, Naples resident JoAnne Russell, the 1977 Wimbledon Ladies' Doubles champion.

"JoAnne is a fabulous player and a good example of the quality of athlete the sport is attracting, especially older tennis players," Welter said. "They like to compete and win."

Welter talks about keeping busy on the courts and he delivers, playing almost daily either outdoors at Brooks Park near Page Field or the Lee Health Wellness Center in Fort Myers.

"I'll play seven tournament's January through April including one in Costa Rica," he said.

Welter also has his family involved with wife Diane and daughter Stephanie Caiazzo playing tournaments.

Perhaps the most well-known family member is Welter's nephew Kyle Yates of Fort Myers, 22, who is ranked nationally and one of 13 5.0 players in Florida. He plays a national schedule after taking the sport seriously in 2013.

“Before he started Kyle said pickleball sounds stupid. Then he picked it up in about one minute,” Welter said. “He was very, very good and a week after starting he beat my butt and he hasn’t looked back.

“It’s a sport where you can play with anyone and I teach and play with partners of all talent levels.”

Clermont swimmer makes a record haul at Senior Games

Clermont swimmer Charlie Weatherbee made his debut in the 85-89 age group over the weekend at the Florida Senior Games in Clearwater just two months after suffering a heart attack.

All in all, Weatherbee felt he could have done a lot better. It's hard to see how.

Weatherbee only finished with four gold medals, a silver medal and two state records in his age group.

"My swims were really nothing to write home about by my standards," Weatherbee said. "But the best part is I realized that I have a shot to break my own records next year."

Weatherbee picked up a gold medal in the 200 Individual Medley, setting a Florida Senior Games record with a time of 4:29.60. That broke Howard Hall's 12-year-old record in the age group by more than 1:35.

He also won gold and set a state record in the 100 free and added gold medals in the 100 IM and 100 back. He picked up a silver medal in the 100 breaststroke.

"The results were good, but there's a lot of room for improvement," Weatherbee said. "I don't like to be too critical of myself because I don't know what the heart attack has taken out of me. But it's not that I'd like to do better, I know I can do better."

Weatherbee wasn't alone in his record-breaking performance with John Cornell of Lady Lake setting five records in the 90-94 age group. On Sunday, he became the age group record holder for the 50 and 100 yard freestyle and 50 backstroke.

In other sports at the Games, Carol Teel, of The Villages, teamed with Cristy Morawski, of Milton,

to win a women's doubles gold with record-setting score in the 60-64 age group.

Winning a pair of shuffleboard gold medals over the weekend was Dave Dean, of The Villages, whose last Florida Senior Games appearance came on the tennis and pickleball courts. Dean won the men's singles gold in the 80-84 age group on Saturday and teamed with Robert Brandt on Sunday to win a doubles gold medal.

Dean won Florida Senior Games tennis and pickleball gold medals in 75-79 age group in 2012. He turned to shuffleboard to keep his competitive juices flowing after major surgery on his foot and ankle two years ago.

"I can't run well so I had to give up racquet sports," Dean said. "I took up shuffleboard and have been doing very well with it, especially with my partner in doubles."

In the 60-64 age group, the Vintage Volleys volleyball team, from The Villages, defeated the Vintage Volleys Senior Team in three games for the gold medal. After dropping game one 25-13, the Junior Volleys won the next two games 25-22 and 15-5. The gold medal winning Vintage Volleys team is made up of Terry Thomas, Heath Davenport, Mimi Morrill, Nanc Dumonz, Barbie Strome, Chris Pusch, Suzanne Vallario and Renie Curry.

Clermont swimmer overcomes medical issues to excel in pool

Charlie Weatherbee trains at NTC in Clermont

CLERMONT — There isn't much that keeps Charlie Weatherbee out of the pool. A day after he stepped on a piece of metal in his garage and had to have a doctor remove it and stitch him up, he was right back swimming.

He may have had trouble walking, but he could swim.

So when he sat with his doctor two weeks after having a heart attack, Weatherbee had to laugh when his doctor asked him when he wanted to start rehabbing.

He'd already been back in the pool for a week.

This weekend, just over two months after having that heart attack, Weatherbee will take part in the Florida Senior Games in Clearwater looking to add to his career haul of 104 medals in 18 previous Senior Games appearances.

"You can't ask for better rehab than being in the pool," Weatherbee said. "It's got everything you need."

Weatherbee, 85, who retired in 1982 as a paramedic lieutenant after a 25-year career with the Miami Fire Department's Fire Rescue Division, knew exactly what was happening on Oct. 21 when he returned from a workout and sat in front of the TV with a bowl of cereal.

"I had that feeling like an elephant was sitting on my chest," Weatherbee said. "I said, 'Uh, oh, this isn't good.' I immediately took an aspirin but I threw that up along with the cereal."

So Weatherbee hopped in the car and drove himself to the hospital. Yes, drove himself.

"I probably should have called an ambulance, but when I got to the hospital I knew exactly what to tell them," Weatherbee said. "The average person waits two days after having a heart attack before telling anyone. They rationalize it and think it can't be a heart attack and figure it's indigestion."

It was heart trouble that got Weatherbee back in the pool after a long break. He started swimming in the 1940s at the Boy's Club in Worcester, Massachusetts, and was an All-American at Miami Jackson High School.

He went on to swim for the University of Miami and was a member of the Hurricanes' undefeated team in 1954.

After taking 36 years off from competitive swimming to raise a family and concentrate on his career, Weatherbee had an angioplasty in 1989 and began swimming again for physical fitness.

He also joined the Florida Mavericks Masters swim team, began competing in the Florida Senior Games and traveled all over the world competing in the World Police & Fire Games.

He accumulated 128 medals and was inducted into the inaugural World Police & Fire Games on June 25 and has been undefeated in the 200 Individual Medley over 24 years of competing at the Games.

"I had adopted the attitude that I was bulletproof because I had a good lifestyle," Weatherbee said. "But after the angioplasty, getting back in the pool seemed like the logical thing to do."

These days Weatherbee trains by swimming about 2,000 yards each workout at Clermont's National Training Center. Although he loves to swim, it can sometimes be a grind. But even at 85, he continues to push himself.

"There are days when I don't want to go to the pool," Weatherbee said. "But once I get in there and starting working, I'm glad I'm doing it and those are the most rewarding days."

Several **Boynton Beach** medalists were in the spotlight during the recent Florida Senior Games, an Olympic-style sports festival for those age 50 and over.

Competing last month at venues in Clearwater and Pinellas County, a delegation from south **Palm Beach County** were involved in the 26th annual attraction. The Boynton Beach group excelled in both bowling and swimming against opponents throughout the state.

Robert Nash, 86, showed his ability on the lanes by winning two gold medals for bowling. Nash finished in first place in the men's singles 85-89 division with a total score of 523 over three games. He also teamed up with Doris Fishler to win the mixed doubles 85-89 age group.

Nash has won 25 medals since he first got involved in the Florida Senior Games back in 2002. He has won 15 gold, five silver and five bronze.

He has qualified on a regular basis for the Florida Senior Games through his success in the Delray Senior Games, which is the local phase that leads up to the statewide competition.

Nash also earned the silver medal in mixed-doubles bowling at the 2017 National Senior Games last June in Birmingham, Ala.

Nash, who makes it a point to stay active through athletics, heads to the bowling alley to play in three different senior leagues each week in **Palm Beach County**.

"I am happy that I am still able to bowl," Nash said. "I enjoy the success and I do the best I can. I enjoy the friendships that I have developed and the interaction. It's good for me and I want to continue to bowl in these events as long as I can."

Nash, who relocated from upstate New York to Boynton Beach, first participated in national bowling events in Syracuse. Nash's highest individual score was a 279. His brother, a competitive bowler, has several 300 games.

Nash also had a passion for baseball, where he was once offered a contract by the Cleveland Indians organization while in high school.

Stan Corwin, 92, also competed and was highly successful in bowling at the Florida Senior Games. He captured the silver medal in the men's singles 90-94 age group with a three-game total of 468, which was just five points behind first-place winner Jack Appel (Boca Raton).

Corwin teamed up with Appel to take the title and the gold medals in the men's doubles 90-94 division. He also joined forces with Appel to win the gold medal in the men's 90-94 division during last summer's National Senior Games.

"I am thrilled to do well and have the opportunity," Corwin said. "It's been satisfying to socialize and I have been able to stay in touch with the participants. It's been good for me."

Chuck Gerber, age 68 and also a Boynton Beach resident, was back at the Florida Senior Games for the second time. He participated in six events and picked up two bronze medals — one in the 100-yard freestyle; the other in the 200-yard freestyle — in the men's 65-69 division.

Gerber also showcased his talents in the 50-yard freestyle, 50-yard breaststroke, 100-yard breaststroke and 200-yard breaststroke.

In 2016, Gerber secured the bronze medal in both the 50-yard breaststroke and the 100-yard breaststroke at the Florida Senior Games. He also qualified for and participated in the National Senior Games last year.

Gerber was a competitive swimmer in high school. While in the marines, he participated in the Navy East Coast Swimming Championships. Since retirement, he has stayed active and swims three times each week.

Florida Senior Games Cycling Time Trials Records Fall on Day at the Beach

December 15, 2017



Riding on a day at Fort DeSoto Park North Beach, with little to no wind, resulted in record times posted by Florida Senior Games Cyclists in the 5K and 10K Time Trials.

A total of 13 age group records were broken, nine by women's cyclists and four by men.

"This may be the best day for riding for record times I've ever seen at an event at Fort DeSoto Park," said Race Director, Felix Hernandez.

The 2016 Florida Senior Games Female Athlete of the Year, Kathy Petrillo, of Jupiter, became the first woman in the history of the Games to record a 5K time of under seven minutes and a 10K time under 15 minutes. Her 5K time of 6:50 was 43 seconds faster than her previous overall best of 7:38 in 2012. Her time of 14:07 in the 10K was 58 seconds better than her mark of 15:05 in 2012. Petrillo holds the 50-54 age groups and topped her own records in the 55-59 age groups set last year.

Besides the favorable conditions, Petrillo pointed out a couple of other reasons for her success today. "It's all in the training I do and I got some new gadgets on my bike," she said.

Also setting age group records were Dave and Louise Watts, who have a Florida residence in Clermont but hail from Elmvale, Ontario. Louise's time of 8:16 in the 5K time trials was 42 seconds faster than the previous record in the 70-74 age group set by Carol Jean Vosburgh, of St. Petersburg, in 2015. Dave's records were set in the 75-79 age group.

"I just love the opportunity to ride in the five-year age groups that the Senior Games offers," said Louis Watts. "In Canada, I have to ride against 40 and 50-year-olds. It's wonderful to come out here and see 80-year-olds riding at the levels they do." 80-year-old Patricia Beam, of Caledonia, IL, set records in both events, topping the previous 5K mark by one minute and 14 seconds.



In Day One of Four in the Pickleball competition, Gabriel Wong, of Ponte Vedra Beach, advanced through the 10-player Men's Singles 70-74 age group bracket to win the gold medal. He defeated Samy Noori, of Dunedin, in the championship match, for his fourth win of the day. He also won a Men's Singles Tennis gold medal on Sunday, defeating four opponents in the 70-74 age group.

"I like both sports," said Wong. "I've been playing tennis for 40 years and just picked up pickleball about two years ago."

Doug Hastings, of Alexandria, VA, won four matches to advance through 65-69 bracket and win the gold medal. He defeated Robert Welter of Cape Coral, who won four consecutive men's singles gold medals prior to this year, in three games. Hastings will compete in six track and field events on Saturday and Sunday.

Diane Bock, of The Villages, won her fourth pickleball women's singles gold medal in six years winning the 60-64 age group.

In the final tennis match of six days of Florida Senior Games Tennis at the Innisbrook Resort and Golf Course, Judi and Aubrey Whitaker, of Lake Wales, won their fourth consecutive mixed doubles gold medal. They defeated Mary Helen Fryman of Cantonment, and Floyd Stevinson, of Pensacola in the 70-74 age group finals, 6-1, 6-1. The Whitaker's won the 65-69 mixed doubles gold from 2014-16 and a 60-64 age group gold medal in 2011.

Pat Beggs and Debbie Foster, of Bradenton, won the Lawn Bowls gold medal at the Clearwater Lawn Bowls and Shuffleboard Complex,, spoiling Clearwater's Dave Murray and Art Allen in their attempt to "ThreePeat." Murray and Allen, winners of the 2015 and 2016 gold medal, suffered an early round loss, and finished in fourth place among the 18 teams competing.

Pickleball continues with Mixed Doubles competition on Friday at The Long Center and the North Greenwood Recreation Center. Horseshoes will be tossed at Ed C. Wright Park and Billiards begins its first day of competition at Stokers Sports Bar and Grill with 9 ball.

A woman of many talents proves that anything is possible at any age

Determined. Powerful. Fearless. These are the words that describe the 2016 Florida Senior Games Athlete of the Year, nationally ranked U.S.A. cyclist, and Jupiter local, Kathy Petrillo. Having been an athlete since she was a young girl, Kathy's passion for health and fitness, as well as her gusto for life is what has pushed her to success.


"I am someone who loves challenging myself and encouraging others. Being named the Athlete of the Year was the greatest privilege," says Kathy.

Setting record times at the 5K and 10K Time Trials in the 55 to 59 age group, she is the 2017 and 2016 Florida Senior Games State Time Trial champion.

In the 2015 Florida Senior Games, she won a gold medal in all four of her cycling events with her fastest times in the 5K and 10K Time Trials, and she was also the top female finisher in the 20K and 40K road races. These impressive times, coupled with perseverance, is what lead her to the 2015 National Senior Games, where she won the gold medal for the 50 to 54 age group in the 20K road race, as well as two silvers and a bronze.

As a certified nutrition and wellness consultant, realtor, and educator, she has created a business of her own called "Wellness Warrior," through which she consults with physicians, individuals, and corporations regarding health and wellness nutrition. She has also created a cycling kit called Jupiter Cycling that includes riding shorts and shirt with a Jupiter Lighthouse-inspired logo printed on each piece.

"I am very passionate about helping others achieve their optimum health and wellness," says Kathy. "We only have one body and the better we take care of it, the better we'll live. I believe at 50 plus, life doesn't stop, it just gets better."

Training for six months in advance of a race by riding four to five days a week from Marcinski Beach to Ft. Pierce, as well as indoor conditioning, the rider sees no end in her future. Kathy affirms, "I will be back for years to come and expect to be competing at age 80 plus."

From John Dillinger to making clubs, Altamonte Springs golfer, 90, shoots straight

With one of the 20th century's most notorious criminals silenced, Charles Madge became curious. Six-year-old boys are inquisitive by nature, and young Charlie was no different. The boy stepped onto the running board of a 1932 Model A Ford without bad intentions.

He just wanted to see what was inside.

"I got on the back and saw two Thompson submachine guns in a locked car," Madge said. "This was an **FBI** car. I don't guess I will ever forget that."

Madge grew up in the same hometown as John Dillinger — Mooresville, Ind., about 20 miles southwest of Indianapolis. Because the Madges and Dillingers knew each other, Charlie attended the gangster's funeral in 1934.

It made for an interesting memory, only the first of many to come. Madge, who turned 90 years old last month, will attempt to earn his fifth Florida Senior Games golf championship Tuesday at Countryside Country Club in Clearwater.

"If you can't putt, you can't beat him," said Madge's nephew, Tom Owen of Jacksonville. "He can't hit it more than 120, 130 yards, but he'll hit it straight. I've always said, 'Uncle Charlie, don't you get bored playing down the middle of the fairway? There's no challenge in it.'"

A retired chemical engineer with a head for statistics, Madge never played golf until buying a set of clubs for \$25 while attending Purdue. Since then, the Altamonte Springs resident has played roughly 520 courses and 7.

a sport that frustrates so many. "Every shot counts. A two-foot putt is equivalent to a 250-yard drive on the scorecard, and you meet so many nice people."

Nick Gandy, director of communications for the Florida Sports Foundation, met Madge for the first time last year. The foundation coordinates the senior games, a nine-day event that will conclude Sunday. The games attract 2,000-2,500 athletes 50 and over and comprise 24 sports.

"He has taken his golfing opportunities and done something to keep his brain and mind sharp," Gandy said. "I just wandered up to him, and I chatted with him for an hour. I went, 'This guy is unbelievable.'"

Madge not only is a golfer. He makes clubs, too.

It started in the early 1970s when he bought a Callaway club, measured the specifications and began constructing his own.

Madge has incorporated a baseball bat, pool cue and the head of a hammer into some of his clubs. Another one almost has it all — a watch, tape measure, compass, laser and even a speaker that plays the "Rocky" theme.

"He's very detailed in just about everything he does," said Madge's friend, Charles Glentz of Palm Bay.

Madge presented one of his clubs to Arnold Palmer, honoring the golf legend's Orchid Island course in Vero Beach, shortly before his death.

"We'll get matched up with a couple of guys," Owen said. "Before it's done, he has taken an interest in them. If they ask him a question, he'll talk about his clubs, because almost anybody notices the putter."

Madge takes blood-pressure and cholesterol medication, and besides the normal issues that go with being born the same year as the first solo, nonstop transatlantic flight ever by Charles Lindbergh, he is relatively healthy.

Madge and his wife of 67 years, Marzetta, have three children, six grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. They keep him busy but still with enough time to maintain spreadsheets and binders of information about what he has accomplished in his favorite sport.

“I’m a golf nut,” he said.

There’s no crime in that.

I've seen senior athletes who have been competitive their entire lives and others who have taken on sports in their golden years. Regardless, they all prove that anyone, at any age, can take charge of their health and make it a priority.

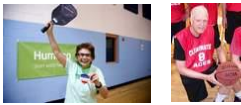

Instead of the old adage "move it or lose it," approximately 2,000 amateur athletes 50 and older celebrated "move it and win it" during the Florida Senior Games, which ended Sunday in Clearwater.

They competed in five-year age brackets in a range of sports, from table tennis to pickleball, from track and field to shuffleboard.

As one of the principal presenters of the games, along with the Florida Sports Foundation, Humana designated four competitors as Humana Game Changers. Before the competition began, LifeTimes talked with two of the honored athletes about their commitment to these games.

Leurene Hildenbrand, 85, is one of this year's Game Changers. She is a retired scientist from Akron, Ohio, who spends half the year in Pinellas Park. Harry Carothers, 74, also of Pinellas Park, was selected in 2015. He retired 15 years ago from the Air Force.

Have you always been active in sports?

Hildenbrand: No. I was always active, but not in sports. They didn't have sports when I was a youngster like they have nowadays. Women had no intramural sports at all. My husband played table tennis in the basement with friends. It was all guys. When we got to Florida, I had more time on my hands and saw in the paper they were playing table tennis in senior games.

Carothers: All my life. My hobby in my retirement has been playing basketball. I played basketball in high school. My dad was always out there (in the backyard) shooting. Kind of a family thing. In the U.S. Air

Force, I did a lot of running or conditioning and baseball. A typical workout would be go to the gym at lunchtime, run 2-3 miles, play full-court basketball till end of break.

How did you get started in the Florida Senior Games?

Hildenbrand: I started playing table tennis in Ohio. Then it snowballed with other sports. I started playing pickleball in Florida at the Long Center in Clearwater. My friend and myself started it there in 2012. Then I started pickleball in Canton, Ohio.

Carothers: Living in Tampa Palms, I didn't know anything about them. I was playing basketball in the park. My primary skill in basketball is outside shooting. Three-point shooting. I'm in a lot of shooting contests, especially at the senior level. A fellow player was telling me about the senior games in 1998. I was amazed at all the county games, then the nationals.

What games will you be playing in the Florida Senior Games?

Hildenbrand: Shuffleboard, table tennis, pickleball, track and field. Just running, 100 and 200 meters.

Carothers: Just basketball.

What's your favorite sport in the games?

Hildenbrand: I don't really have a favorite. I play pickleball and table tennis the most. I do other sports — cycling, shooting, archery, just about everything, depending on the games. Basketball shooting? I'm not very good at that. Maybe pickleball, maybe table tennis. Pickleball is so easy to learn and you progress quickly.

Carothers: Basketball. I used to do volleyball. ...

What do the games mean to you?

Hildenbrand: I can get people to feel like I feel. You feel better because you're out there exercising. You're out there getting healthier. What does all the literature tell you? Get out there and move.

Carothers: I do it for fun. I have always had a lifestyle that had a lot of activity. My whole life I've worked out. When I retired, I gave up running because my knees began to bother me. I play full-court basketball at the Clearwater YMCA three days a week. I play against guys in their 20s and 30s. I'm a fixture over there. Over the past 18-19 years, I've won over 30 gold medals in the Florida Senior Games.

How do you train?

Hildenbrand: I like to train and I do train. I'm gone every day for something — pickleball in the morning and tennis in the evening. I may be cycling. Everything I have tried, I have liked. Every sport was new. I love rollerblading. Up North, I ice skate. ... I let people know I haven't been doing this all my life. I have more time since I've been retired.

Carothers: I play five times a week. When I'm not playing basketball, I'm over at the side shooting. I never sit down and rest. If I sit down, I'm going to tighten up and (in the) next game, I won't be any good at all. ...

What do you get out of the games?

Hildenbrand: I have too many medals — over 1,000 medals and trophies. That's not the driving force. It was in the beginning. My first medal, oh, wow. By talking to these people and seeing them change, that's a big reward for me.

Carothers: The camaraderie, if anything. Gold medals aren't the big deal. Getting out there and competing. People who are in sports all their lives really like competing. You compete against other guys — your peer group. If you lose, you lose. If you win, it's enjoyable. (They're) your friends before the competition (and) your friends after the competition. Playing with guys who have a similar mind-set. Their priorities and lifestyles are very similar.

You've been given the title of Humana Game Changer. What does that mean for you?

Hildenbrand: I was really surprised. I tell (people), yes, you can do it. Until you try and get improvement, you can't find out. Not only is it good for you, you will enjoy it, mentally, spiritually. That's what I get back. That's the reward — their enjoyment, their accomplishments.

Carothers: They're in the insurance business. They would like all seniors to be as healthy as they can get. They sponsor the national senior games, a very healthy activity for seniors to get involved in. My understanding is (Humana) wants to recognize people who exemplify healthy aging (and) provide motivation for other seniors to develop healthy lifestyles. I think if you're looking for a healthy lifestyle, it has to involve exercise.

Locals earn wins at Florida Senior Games

More than 2,000 athletes competed in the 26th annual Florida Senior Games in early December in Clearwater and Pinellas County. The athletes were from 38 states, Puerto Rico, the Bahamas and Canada.

The Florida Senior Games are presented annually by the Florida Sports Foundation, a division of Enterprise Florida, Inc. According to Nick Gandy, Florida Sports Foundation Director of Communications, a number of participants were from Marion County, including several who brought home gold, silver and bronze medals.

Among some of the highlights, Gandy noted, were, "The fellows at the horseshoe courts were telling me that Charles "Buddy" Short was probably the best pitcher out there that day. He had 20 ringers in 30 pitches, playing only one match."

Gandy also said that Mirna Castrejon won her three gold medals in the 5K Road Race and 400- and 800-meter runs pretty handily.

"In the 5K Road Race, she was the top overall women's finisher by more than a minute. She won the 400-meter run by 29 seconds over the second place finisher in her age group. In the 800-meter, she was 20 seconds ahead of the silver medalist," he said.

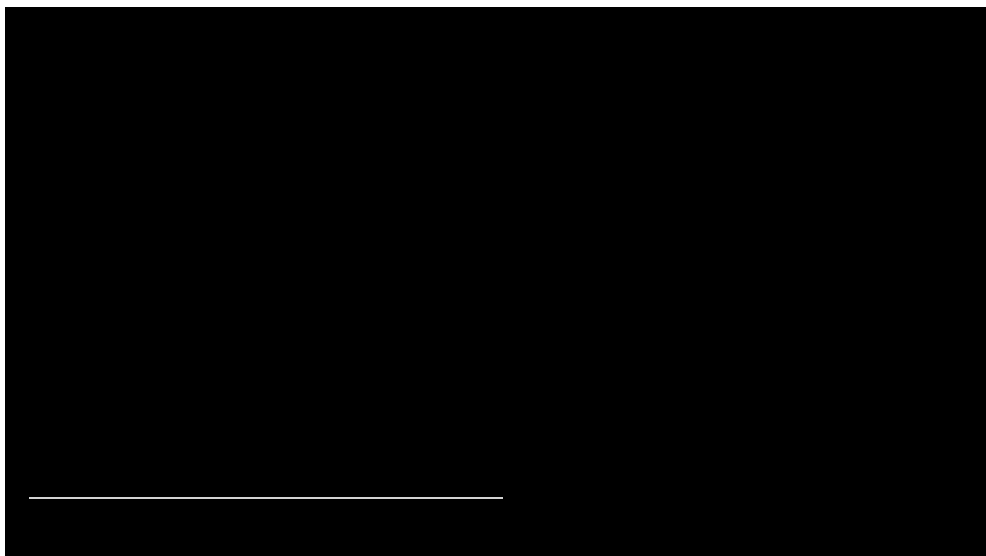

Over 2,000 athletes competed in the 26th Annual Florida Senior Games that ended Sunday in Clearwater and Pinellas County.

Tallahassee athletes turned in a number of solid performances.

In track and field, Rodney Atherton cleared a record-breaking high jump of 5 feet, 2 inches, in the 6064 age group.

Atherton broke his own record of 5 feet he set last year. Atherton attempted a jump of 5 feet 3 inches, but was unsuccessful.

She met Robert Case while attending Boston University, where she studied physical therapy. Case, who had served as a bombardier during World War II, would become a foreign service officer.

As a result, they spent three decades overseas, mostly in the Middle East. Together they raised six children, one now deceased. Chase has four grandchildren. One of those grandchildren, supermodel Cameron Russell, is pregnant with her first great grandchild.

Russell's mother, Robin Chase, is a transportation entrepreneur who was listed as one of Time's 100 Most Influential People in 2009 and has won numerous environmental awards.

In 1980 Robert Chase retired and they moved to St. Augustine. She began her

third life.

Robert Chase died in 2002. Shirley Chase is still flourishing, thanks in part to the 30 minutes she spends swimming each day. That daily swim is part of an exercise routine that also includes pull-ups, rides on a stationary bicycle and an occasional round of golf.

"I keep in the best shape I can," Chase said.

Her doctor has told Chase, who has bad knees, that her exercise routine, particularly the swimming, has kept her out of a wheelchair.

Growing up, Chase never swam competitively. But in her old age, she does.

Earlier this month she traveled to Clearwater to swim in the 2017 Florida Senior Games. She swam in three races, winning the 50-yard freestyle and the 500-yard freestyle and finishing second in the 100-yard freestyle, all in the 90-94 age group.

She was also one of four people chosen as a Humana Game Changer, an award which recognizes athletes who exemplify healthy aging and provide inspiration for others.

She's already making plans for next year's Florida Senior Games at which she hopes to qualify for the next National Senior Games, which will be held in Albuquerque, N.M., in July 2019.

"It's going to cost me bucks, big bucks," she said. "But you can't take it with you."

Besides exercising regularly, Chase is an avid gardener. She's also an artist and art collector. Her waterfront home is full of art, some she created herself and some she collected over the years, including a number of pieces she acquired while living in the Middle East.

"I've had a good life," she said. "I'm a lucky woman. I'm still alive and I'm still competing."

She added another win in the 80-84 horseshoe toss.

Janet Brown did the same in the 65-69 age group with a 174 and Linda Del Valle followed with a win in the 75-79 age group after finishing with a 226. Senior athlete travels many roads in many ways

If Rodney Atherton's track and field training diary were a passport, he would be recognized as a world traveler.

After setting high jump, triple jump and pole vault records at the 2016 Florida Senior Games, in the 60-64 age group, he has traveled to six track and field meets around the state and country, sharing his Tallahassee-based talents.

In 2017, Atherton competed in the Emerald Coast Senior Games (Destin), Capital City Senior Games, Good Life Games (Pinellas County), The Villages Senior Games, the USATF Florida Championships, in Jacksonville, and the USATF Masters National Championships in Baton Rouge.

At the USATF National Championships, Atherton won a gold high jump medal, silver medals in the triple jump and pentathlon, and a bronze in pole vault. He also finished fourth in long jump, sixth in the 100-meter hurdles and ninth in discus. That's six events in four days.

His medal count could have been higher but during the 100-meter hurdles, he fell after hitting the final hurdle, got back up, and finished sixth place. "That was a good meet," he said.

He earned his pentathlon silver medal for his performance in five events; long jump, javelin, discus, 200 meter and 1500 meter runs. Atherton entered the event ranked second in the country in his age group, behind Noel Ruebel, a high school and collegiate track and field coach, and top ranked 60-64 age group pentathlon athlete. Atherton needed to finish five seconds ahead of Ruebel in the final event, the 1500 meter run, for the gold medal.

"He was on my tail the whole race but I couldn't pull away," Atherton said. "I finished just two seconds ahead of him for the silver medal."

He grew up in a military family and moved around quite a bit before settling in Tallahassee. He ran track at Godby High School, attended Tallahassee Community College and Florida State University before settling into a career with the State of Florida where he worked for 38 years.

He has a variety of hobbies besides track and field that put him in the public eye. Atherton is a member of the Capital Chordsmen, an a capella singing group that practices at the Tallahassee Senior Center. As a member of the Chordsmen, he also sings in Barber Shop Quartets. "I can sing just about anything, tenor, bass, lead, baritone," he said. "It helps to be versatile." Versatility is an understatement for Atherton.

Since retiring, he trains every morn-

ing at either the Florida A&M or Leon High School track. "I eat in the afternoon to regain calories burned in the morning. Then I do some weight training." His daily training diary keeps track of his accomplishments on the track and where he travels to meets.

After graduating from Godby High School, his versatile nature led him to take a break from track and field to become a member of the FSU Flying High Circus during his junior and senior years (1977-78). "I did some juggling, the slack wire and high wire and the quartet adagio," he said. "That's a routine where a couple of guys throw a girl around."

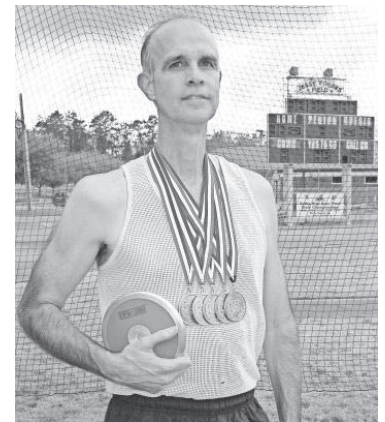
How does one go from track and field to a circus performer? His dad was such

a fan of the circus, his parents first date was to a circus performance. On their honeymoon, they traveled to Sarasota to visit the Ringling Museum. Within the last five years, Rodney's son followed in his dad's footsteps and also was a member of the FSU Circus doing juggling acts.

After graduating from college and spending two years as a circus performer, Atherton wondered, "How would I have done if I ran track?" He approached a Florida State track coach and was allowed to compete in a Metro Conference Tournament (FSU's conference affiliation at the time) as an unattached athlete. "My results would have earned All-Conference status," he said. "I was a le-

gitimate contender."

Besides competing in five sport events like the pentathlon, he also competes in the 10-sport decathlons. He recently competed at a USATF meet in Jacksonville against Open Division athletes of all ages. His performance was the third best overall in Masters competition in his age group. With that as a motivator, he has set a goal to establish a new American record in 2018.

Standing just under six foot three inches tall, Atherton admits his height gives him an advantage in the jumping events and allows him to excel in the pole vault as he can place his hands higher on the pole. While he is very visible around town between his track and field training, as a Capital Chordsmen singer and his career with the State of Florida, it's his method of transportation that makes him most noticeable. "I'm the Segway guy," he proudly proclaims.

Standout athlete Doris Prokopi, age 82, who competed in shot put, discus, 400-meter dash, long jump and about 15 other events during last month's Tampa Bay Senior Games, has dozens of medals to show for her efforts.

"I've got so many, I give them away," said Prokopi, dressed in shades of pink — her trademark knee socks a hot pink — as she waited for the shuffleboard contest to begin at David M. Barksdale Senior Citizen Center in Tampa last month.

The Land O' Lakes resident qualified to compete in most events at the next level, the Florida Senior Games, set to run from Dec. 2 through Dec. 10 in Clearwater. But she's entering only the swimming contests, she said. She doesn't want to drive home and back for events or pay the extra entry fees, she explained.

More than 2,000 athletes age 50 and older are expected to converge on Clearwater for the state championships. More than 425 people participated during the two-week Tampa Bay Senior Games in October — put on by the county, Tampa and Temple Terrace recreation departments.

Prokopi, a native of Germany who still speaks with an accent 62 years after moving to the United States, had not taken part in athletics before entering the senior games 22 years ago. A homemaker who worked part-time jobs, she had her hands full raising two boys. When the younger son went off to college, she suddenly had lots of free time. She decided to take up swimming at a YMCA pool near her home, and that's when she heard about the senior games.

"When I started I was 60. I won everything every year," she said, still seeming surprised at herself. In the year 1994, she was named Female Athlete of the Year by the organizers of the Florida Senior Games.

What Prokopi and other participants like most about the games, they say, is the camaraderie. They meet new friends, have a few laughs and get some exercise.

On a balmy weekday morning at the Barksdale Senior Center, competitors in the various age categories signed up for the shuffleboard contests as songs from the '50s and '60s — Dream Lover, Come Go with Me, Rhythm of the Rain — filled the air.

Prokopi and Gail Militello, 81, faced off on the shuffleboard courts, chatting amiably while trying to knock each other's disk out of the high-point boxes. Prokopi won and played three others in the age 80 to 85 elimination rounds before taking another gold.

While more strenuous pursuits, such as the 400-meter run, standing and running long jumps and the 50-yard breaststroke, are available, so are more sedentary options, such as dominoes, bean bag toss and bunco.

Militello, of south Tampa, started off playing pickle ball at the Barksdale Center. The tennis-like game is wildly popular among seniors.

"They taught us how to play and we all became addicted," said Militello, who has participated in the Tampa Bay Senior Games for the last two

years. She competed in pickle ball, horseshoes and shuffleboard and has no interest in advancing to the Florida games. "I'm just here for fun."

Donna Van Name, 80, who entered the discus, shot put, long jump and others, said the games gave her a chance to play sports she never played before.

"If you don't know how, they show you how to do them. They let you practice," she said.

Prokopi wishes the games happened more often than once a year. "That's not enough."

Her husband, Bill, on the other hand, is "not an outdoor person," she said. "He listens to his music and does his puzzles."

When Senior Games time comes around, he's fine following his own pursuits while she goes off to win medals. He always tells her, "Don't forget to come home."

Villages Athletes Ready to Shine at State Games

Running. Throwing. Jumping. Swimming. Shooting. Dinking. Rolling. Pedaling.

If there's an action with a medal attached to it, a Villager will be doing it the next week at the Florida Senior Games.

More than 250 residents from The Villages will be in attendance in Clearwater for the nine-day event, which begins Saturday and showcases the best senior athletes from around the

Sunshine State.

Nick Gandy, the Florida Sports Foundation's director of communications, has been impressed by The Villages' increased presence and continual improvement each year at the state games.

"I have enjoyed watching many of the athletes from The Villages develop their talents over the years to win more medals, set records and make themselves known on a national level," Gandy said.

The field of competitors from Florida's Friendliest Hometown this year ranges from experienced veterans to first-timers, but all are equally excited for the opportunity to face some of the best competition the state has to offer.

Andrea Johnson, of the Village of Chatham, will be competing in six swimming events in her first state games this year.

Johnson moved to The Villages just over a year ago and has been swimming with The Villages Aquatic Swim Team for nine months, during which she competed in The Villages Senior Games and the Gainesville Senior Games. After retirement, she wanted to pick up the sport again after swimming competitively in high school.

Although it is her first time at the state games, Johnson isn't going to be intimidated by the competition.

"I'm looking to win four of my events and take gold or silver in the other two," Johnson said.

Brad Martin, of the Village of Charlotte, also is competing in his first Florida Senior Games, challenging some of the best pickleball players not just in the state, but in the world.

Martin signed up for The Villages Senior Games on a whim shortly after moving to Florida three years ago, but quickly found he was in over his head.

"I didn't know what I was getting into," Martin said. "I got thumped in my first two games that year."

Now, with more tournament experience under his belt, Martin is ready to compete at the state level. He and his partner, Ron Rowe, will be competing in the 65-69 men's doubles tournament next week.

Rowe missed The Villages Senior Games because of a knee surgery, but qualified at the Gainesville Senior Games. The Village of Collier resident has played pickleball in the Pennsylvania, New York and Maryland state Senior Games, but says he expects the Florida state games to be the toughest of the bunch.

“The competition up there is nowhere near what it is down here,” Rowe said. “I’m looking forward to seeing where we stack up with the best players from the state of Florida.”

Like Rowe, Rick Riddle has competed in state games outside of Florida, running in the Texas Senior Games when he lived in the Lone Star State. Now a resident of the Village of Dunedin, Riddle will be returning to the Florida Senior Games in pursuit of two new medals, but with no illusions about how difficult a feat that will be.

“It’s a lot like any regional competition in that you’re going to see some world-class competitors,” Riddle said.

Riddle is an accomplished runner in his own right, two times a world record holder in the men’s 60-64 4x200 meter and 4x400 relays while racing for the Houston Elite Track Club. He is not the only record holder who will be on the track next week though, as one of his teammates from that relay team will be running against him in the 200.

Riddle also coaches the 400-meter runners with The Villages Track and Field Club and said he has seen their eagerness build as the games approach.

One of those runners is Peggy Peck, of the Village of St. Charles, who is competing in 11 events this year — 10 track and field as well as basketball. The key to being ready to compete, she says, is to stick to her very busy training schedule — she runs and practices jumps three days a week, followed immediately by javelin and discus practice.

Peck isn’t a stranger to a busy schedule at the State Games — she entered the same slate in 2016 — but she did say that making it to every event is a challenge, as some may overlap.

“That’s happened quite often, so I have to pay attention,” Peck said.
