Ribbon Cutting and Cycling Time Trials Open 2019 Florida Senior Games

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. – The 2019 Florida Senior Games presented by Humana opened its 10-day competition Friday, welcoming the first of over 1,500 athletes to the Greater Fort Lauderdale/Broward County area.

To kick off the 2019 competition, the Florida Senior Games partnered with Mayor Hazelle Rogers of Lauderdale Lakes to host an opening ribbon cutting celebration at the City of Lauderdale Lakes Multi-Purpose Building.

The afternoon featured guest appearances by Ed Simon, Executive Vice President of Greater Fort Lauderdale CVB; Marvin E. Green, Jr., Vice President of Amateur Sports with the Florida Sports Foundation; Senator Perry E. Thurston, Jr.; and Angela Adams Suggs, President & CEO of the Florida Sports Foundation.

After opening remarks from Mayor Rogers and President Suggs, Senator Thurston welcomed the athletes, directors, and spectators to the community and invited each to participate in Saturday's Bid Whist at Mitchell Moore Park in Pompano.

Following the official ribbon cutting, Suggs awarded the "first" gold medals to Simon, Saskia Fisher, Senior Manager of Sports Business Development with the Greater Fort Lauderdale CVB, Mayor Rogers, Nyoka Stewart, the 50+ Statewide Seniors Dominoes Chairman, and Babatunde Epoyun, Broward County Senior Games director. Also receiving a gold medal was 85-year old Eulalee Bax, who answered the call when Mayor Rogers asked the crowd, "Is there anyone here 85 or older?" Bax promptly raised her hand and declared she was 89.

Besides the ceremonial opening, Games athletes left the starting line with the first competition, the Cycling 5K Time Trials at Scott Park in Miami Gardens.

Returning to Florida Senior Games Cycling competition for the first time since 2016, Eric Lippens, of Naples, picked up right where he left off three years ago.

Lippens set a new 5K Time Trials record in the 75-79 age group, crossing the finish line with a time of 7:46. Lippens also holds the 5K record in the 65-69 age group, which he set in 2013. His participation in the Florida Senior Games dates back to 2007 when he won the 5K Time Trials gold medal in the 60-64 age group.

The top overall men's time of the morning was turned in by Peter Wimberg, of Cincinnati, Ohio, who rode the course in 7:14, to win the gold medal in the 55-59 age group. Wimberg is also the 55-59 age group age group record holder with the top overall time of Games in 2017, when he completed the 5K course in 6:26.

Gary Smith, of Indialantic, became the first recumbent cyclist to compete in the 80-84 age group and his time of 9:00 established an age group record.

Marie Volkhardt Rossnagle, of Sarasota, turned in the top women's time, with a 8:10, to win the 55-59 age group.

The Games continue Saturday with action in six sports. All events of the 2019 Florida Senior Games are free and the public is encouraged to attend.

Records Falls at First Full Day of 2019 Florida Senior Games presented by Humana

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. – The second day of competition at the 2019 Florida Senior Games presented by Humana began with a test of endurance as runners, power walkers, and race walkers pushed their physical limits during the 5K road race at Vista View Park in Davie. After the sun rose over the hill-topped park, harriers of each discipline toed the line for the 3.1 mile course.

In the 5K run, newcomer Tri Thornhill, an attorney from Lakeland, turned in the top time of the morning, finishing the two-lap course in 17:40.5. Thornhill's time was 40 seconds ahead of the second-place finisher, Thomas Hampton (18:20). Janet Canfield, of Titusville, was the first female finisher, besting the course in 23:24.1.

Known for his physical strength and stride, Karl Hughes, of Seminole, repeated as the Race Walk champion. The two-time Bob Fine Award Winner finished the course in 30:08.5. "Each year, it's about pushing yourself to the next limit," said Hughes. "I look forward to competing next weekend on the track and being back here in 2020." On the women's side, Ann Harsh was crowned the champion on her home turf as the Fort Lauderdale native took the women's title with a 33:27.5 finish.

Wrapping up the road race competition were the Power Walkers as Virginia Harshman (34:57.0) and Harold Dockins (30:04.3) took home the individual titles.

Over a 24-hour period between Friday and Saturday morning, Norberto Olivera was on a starting line in three difference races. The 2019 Florida Senior Games Cycling Time Trials, on Friday morning, a 5K Road Race in West Palm Beach, Friday night and the 2019 Florida Senior Games 5K Road Race.

"It was my goal to win first place in all three races," he said before the 5K Road Race Saturday morning. He accomplished the first-place finish in the 5K Road Race, but not in the 5K Cycling Time Trials, even though he had one of his best performances.

"I didn't have a chip on my bike," Olivera said. "I switched bikes at the last minute and didn't move the chip to the new bike."

In the 5K Road Race, the chip was affixed to his race number and he crossed the finish line with a time of 20:41.20 to win the gold medal in the 55-59 age group.

Moving to the pool, Debbie Cavanaugh, a swimmer from Fort Lauderdale, with a long history of accolades, added her name to the Florida Senior Games Record book to join her husband Cav, who has held the Men's 65-69 group record in the 100-yard freestyle since 2000.

Debbie set new records in the Women's 60-64 age group 100-and 200-yard backstroke. Cav, swimming in the Florida Senior Games for the first time since his record-setting performance in 2000, won a gold medal in the 200-yard freestyle and a silver medal in the 100 IM, in the 80-84 age group.

Overall, 16 age group records fell Saturday at the Coral Springs Aquatic Center. By setting a 200-yard backstroke record in the 65-69 age group with a time of 2:30.70, Brian Voisard, of Winter Haven, is now

a record holder in four different age groups, dating back to 2005. He holds the 500-yard freestyle records in the 50-54, 55-59 and 60-64 age groups.

Moving into the 70-74 age group, Nathan Leech, of The Villages, set age group records in the 400-Yard IM and 200-Yard Backstroke. While setting the 70-74 age group in the 200-yard backstroke, Leech's record in the 65-69 age group fell to Tom Bliss, of Melbourne, the 2013 FSG Male Athlete of the Year.

"There are so many good swimmers coming up behind me," Leech said. "Guys younger than me had the benefit of goggles while growing up giving them the opportunity to spend more time in the pool." Leech recalled never wearing goggles while swimming in high school and only having the opportunity once he started swimming at Purdue University in the late 1960s.

In the Bag Toss competition held at the Vernon Hargay Youth Enrichment Center, in Miramar, Claudette Braswell, the 2007 Female Athlete of the Year, won her sixth consecutive Bag Toss gold medal in the 80-84 age group defeating Betty Harstad, of Winter Haven. Braswell, from Lake Wales, will return to the Greater Fort Lauderdale area on Saturday for the Basketball Shooting events. She has won all three events, Free Throw, Spot Shooting and Timed Field Goal shooting for the last 11 consecutive years, dating back to 2007, when she competed in the 70-74 age group.

Ocala's James Harden had the highest score of the day at Fort Lauderdale Archers with an 885 of a possible 900 in the Compound Release event, to win the 55-59 gold medal and set the age group record. He topped the previous record by seven points and is now the record holder in the 50-54 and 55-59 age groups with the two highest scores in the history of Florida Senior Games Archery. Only Harden and Frank Gandy, of Bartow, have shot scores over 880 in the Compound Release event.

In reaching the score, Harden hit 36 X-ring shots of 90 total arrows shot. The middle X-ring of the target measures five inches in diameter, according to FSG Archery Sport Director Tim Austin. Harden hit the X ring from distances ranging between 40 and 60 yards.

Saturday afternoon featured Bid Whist and Dominoes competitions, challenging the mental strength of the participants. Hosted by Senator Perry E. Thurston, Jr., the Bid Whist championships awarded three teams with gold, silver, and bronze medals. The duo of Dr. Horace C. Broy, Jr. & Earl DePass took home the gold, while Earnestine Thomas & Cynthia Hankerson and Valerie Williams & Yvonne Williams finished second and third, respectively.

At the Dominoes Championship, Secretary of Commerce and Enterprise Florida's President and CEO Jamal Sowell made a special visit to the Northwest Focal Point Senior Center in Margate, welcoming competitors and thanking each of them for their participation and economic impact in the Broward County area during the 2019 Games.

Switching gears to the final event of the day, men's and women's doubles and mixed duos of keglers bonded together for an afternoon of pin striking at Strikers Family Sports Complex. Gerald Teel and Ed Fenstermacher, of The Villages, established a new Men's Doubles Bowling record in the 70-74 age group, with a combined score of 1395. The duo topped the previous record by 84 pins, that was set in 2010 by Richard Merrill and Samuel Anzalone, also of The Villages. In the six games combined, Teel and Fenstermacher had individual scores of 223 or higher in five games.

Anna Fatseas and Jeanne Harlan traveled all the way from Pensacola to set the Women's Doubles age group record in the 70-74 age group with a combined score of 1103.

The Games continue Sunday with action in four sports. All events of the 2019 Florida Senior Games are free and the public is encouraged to attend.

FSG's Opening Weekend of Action Sees 11 Sports over Three Days

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. – The Florida Senior Games' opening weekend of action came a close on Sunday afternoon as a steady sprinkle of rain christened the Fort Lauderdale area, welcoming a new week of competition starting Monday.

Three Florida Senior Games cyclists riding together in a group, well ahead of the rest of the 40K Road Race field on the streets of Miami Gardens this morning were Arturo Soler, Christopher Creyts and Carlos Fuentes, who all crossed the finish line within once second of each other.

The 50-54 age group trio established themselves ahead of the rest of the cyclists going into the second of eight laps on the 40K Course. Soler's chip registered the gold medal winning time .008 seconds head of Creyts, of Temple Terrace, and .092 of a second ahead of Fuentes, of Hialeah Gardens.

In the 20K Road Race that started off the morning of racing, Creyts was edged at the finish line by Fuentes, with a time .018 of a second quicker.

The top women's finishers were Mary Jo Kurchinski, from Palm Harbor, in the 20K and Kimberly Besuden, of Tavares, in the 40K.

Bowling's second day of competition gave way to a storied tale of Ed Fenstermacher, of Summerfield, as the kegler unknowingly tabbed a hat-trick of championships, winning three Bowling gold medals in three different age groups. In earning the three gold medals, Fenstermacher knocked down 2,016 points in nine games.

On Sunday, Fenstermacher won the Men's Singles 75-79 age group gold medal with a three-game score of 638, 51 pins ahead of the silver medalist, Albert Bennett, of Ormond Beach. On Saturday, he teamed with Gerald Teel to win the 70-74 Men's Doubles gold medal and set an age group record, with Fenstermacher's score of 727. He also teamed with Barb Johnson, of The Villages, to win the 50-54 Mixed Doubles gold medal, contributing a score of 651.

"Since I turned 75 earlier this year, I've been bowling really well," Fenstermacher said. "It's probably been one of my better years. I got very comfortable this weekend, and my equipment matched up really well. I used the same ball all weekend and stayed on same line the whole time. I also tried not to pay attention to what everyone else was doing."

His three-game total in Men's Doubles was the highest of the weekend of all events and in eight of his nine games of the weekend, he topped a score of 200 or more. His top single-game score, of 257, came in the first game of Men's Doubles competition.

Three Women's Singles Age Group records were also set on Sunday in the 65-69, 70-74 and 75-79 age groups. Luanne Giragosian's three game total of 670 topped the previous record by 36 pins. Giragosian also won a mixed doubles gold medal on Saturday, with her husband, Rich, in the 65-69 age group.

Lynn Barta, of The Villages, set a new record in the 70-74 age group, that had been in place since 2000, with her score of 635, 62 pins more than the previous mark. Plant City's Shirley Bruggeman established a new mark in the 75-79 age group with her score of 554.

Another 17 age group records fell at the Swimming competition at the Coral Springs Aquatic Center, to bring the weekend total to 33 records broken. Three athletes, Michael Aubrey, Michael Smith and Nathan Leech, had two record-setting performances to bring their weekend record total to four each. Aubrey's records came in the 55-59 age group, Smith in the 60-64 age group and Leech in the 70-74 age group.

Smith, who swam competitively in his youth, got back in the pool in July 2017 after a 42-year absence. Since that time he has won numerous gold medals and broke his own record Sunday in the 50-yard butterfly.

Debbie Cavanaugh, swimming in her first Florida Senior Games, added a third 65-69 age group record and her husband, Cav established a new 80-84 age group record in the 100-yard freestyle, to go along with his 65-69 age group record in the event in 2000.

Day four of the 10-day competition is a single-sport feature as Table Tennis takes the main stage. All events of the 2019 Florida Senior Games are free and the public is encouraged to attend.

All the World is on Stage at Florida Senior Games Table Tennis

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. – FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. – The first of two days of 2019 Florida Senior Games presented by Humana Table Tennis at the Broward Table Tennis Club featured a wide variety of cultures playing the game that is held in high regard around the world for its speed, reaction time and agility.

In one of the more competitive divisions of the 50-69 age groups in action on Monday, Susie Tran, from Melbourne, and Nelson Ngo, from Orlando, won the Mixed Doubles 60-64 age group winning four of their five round robin format games.

Tran and Ngo's four wins came in three-game sweeps of five game matches and their fourth was a four-game win. Their only loss was in three games, all by scores of 11-9 to Debra Curtis and Gordon Weinblatt, of The Villages.

Tran and Ngo, both originally from Vietnam, fled the country after the Vietnam War. Tran left in April of 1975 and relocated to the U.S. living with her sister in North Carolina until 1977.

"My sister and her husband lived in a normal-sized house, but there were so many of us that came to live with her, we had to camp out in the yard for a short time until we found places to live," Tran said. She then moved to Orlando and earned a degree from then Valencia Community College in 1979. She has lived in Melbourne since 1987, where she is a Real Estate broker.

Ngo has a similar story, leaving Vietnam in 1977 for China and relocating to San Jose, California in 1979. He moved to Orlando in 2011 and works at Collins Aerospace and provides table tennis lessons to young players at no cost. He began playing table tennis at his school in China where a table was available.

The 2019 Florida Senior Games are the first for Tran and the second appearance for Ngo, who won a pair of silver medals at the 2018 Games.

Adding a European flair to the Games was Derek Lundie, who won his third consecutive gold medal in the Men's Singles 60-64 age group. The retired dentist and his wife, Sandra, split time between Winter Garden and Hamilton, Scotland, a town 12 miles southeast of Glasgow.

When not winning Florida Senior Games medals, Lundie keeps in practice at European Veteran's Tournaments, which is the equivalent of Senior Games competitions in the U.S. He competed in the 2019 European Championships in Budapest, Hungary and plans to play in a 2020 Championship in France.

"The European Championships draw as much as 4,000 players and just as many spectators," he said. "Table tennis is very popular in Europe and in Germany it's the second largest sport behind soccer."

While this is only Lundie's third Florida Senior Games since 2017, he has played in a table tennis tournament in each of the last 47 years. "I started playing when I was 15," he said.

Lundie was undefeated in five matches in the Men's Singles 60-64 age group with none of his wins stretching into a five-game match. He defeated Gordon Weinblatt, of The Villages, in the championship match for the gold medal.

Day five of the 10-day competition sees a return to the final day of Table Tennis with the 70 and above age group and kicks off the Tennis championships that run through Sunday, December 15. All events of the 2019 Florida Senior Games are free and the public is encouraged to attend.

Florida Senior Games Athletes Play a Sport for Life

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. – The 2019 Florida Senior Games presented by Humana offers several sports that can be called, “Sports for Life.”

That saying held true today at the Table Tennis competition at the Broward Table Tennis Club for the 70+ age groups.

John Shultz, of Lakeland, won a medal in his 27th consecutive Florida Senior Games Table Tennis competition dating back to 1993.

Shultz won the Men’s Singles 80-84 age group and teamed with Deane Chickering, of The Villages, to win the Men’s Doubles 80-84 age group. Chickering, who turned 85 this year, won the gold medal in the Men’s Singles 85-89 age group.

Both men use table tennis and other activities to stay active and healthy. Shultz moved to Lakeland to take advantage of the Lakeland Table Tennis Club’s weekly activities.

“I now play three times a week instead of the once a week when I lived in Inverness,” Shultz said. He also plays at times when younger players are practicing at the Simpson Park Community Center in Lakeland to have better competition.

“Yeah, John gives those younger guys fits,” said Florida Senior Games Table Tennis Sport Director, Brad Woodington, who also lives in Lakeland. “Those guys in the club are learning new tricks from a good teacher.”

Chickering, not only plays Table Tennis in The Villages for two hours, four days a week, he has also taken up pickleball and plays up to four hours five days a week.

“I also go skiing for a month out of the year,” Chickering said.

The duo has teamed together to win Florida Senior Games Men’s Doubles gold medals six times since 2010 and have plenty of more gold medals in their sights.

“I don’t seem to be aging as quickly as a lot of people I know,” Shultz said.

After receiving her 2018 Florida Senior Games Female Athlete of the Year Award at the beginning of the day’s action, Deb Harrison, of The Villages, won the Women’s Singles 70-74 Age Group gold medal and followed up Women’s Doubles gold with Marilyn Cates and a Mixed Doubles gold with Michael Rusaw.

It was Harrison and Rusaw’s seventh Mixed Doubles gold medal since 2010. The three gold medals raised Harrison’s Table Tennis medal count to 21 since 2010. She has also won 31 Pickleball medals since 2004, but will not be competing this year due to scheduling conflicts.

The first of six days of Tennis held first serve today as Men's and Women's Singles began play at the Cypress Park Tennis Center. Preliminary matches were played in the men's 60-64, 70-74, 75-79, and 80-84 age groups with championship matches beginning Wednesday morning at 10 a.m.

Three individual champions were crowned on day one as Cheng Hung took home the first gold medal of the day, winning the 85-89 men's title with a 6-0, 6-1 victory over Danny Holcomb.

Triple-sport athlete Judith Daniel, of Jacksonville Beach, won the women's 75-79 singles title. This past Saturday, Daniel captured her first gold of the Games, winning the 75-79 division with a 27:22 finish in the 5K road race. To close out her 2019 Senior Games experience, Daniel will compete in six events at the Track and Field Championships on Sunday, December 15.

Michael DiNenna, of Palm City, took the gold in the 50-54 singles final, outlasting silver medalist Joseph Dalton in the championship match.

Day six of the 10-day competition sees the second day of the six-day Tennis championships that run through Sunday, December 15. The Golf championships tee off with the 18-hole championship, including the first day of the 36-hole competition. All events of the 2019 Florida Senior Games are free and the public is encouraged to attend.

Rainy Day Can't Keep the Seniors Away as Day 6 of FSG 2019 Continues with Golf and Tennis

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. – Florida Senior Games golfers took to the links on Wednesday morning under clear blue skies. They returned to the clubhouse after completing 18 holes with a light rain falling.

Winners in the 18-hole competition and leaders in the 36-hole event on scoresheets posted in the Jacaranda Golf Course Clubhouse featured some very familiar names of Florida Senior Games past. The overall low score of the day was posted by Edward Scheid, of Bradenton, who shot a 77 in the 18-hole competition to win the 75-79 age group gold medal. Scheid, who's round featured 10 pars and no holes over a bogey, has been playing in the Florida Senior Games since 2002 when he won a 55-59 age group bronze medal. He was the National Senior Games gold medalist in the 2003 and 2005 Games in the 60-64 age group.

Scheid's total topped silver medalist, Larry Rule, of West Palm Beach, by six strokes. Rule also has a long history in the Games winning his first gold medal in the 65-69 age group at the 2005 Florida Senior Games. Rule and Scheid's foursome also included Richard and Lionel Pepin, of Lakeland, also long-time Florida Senior Games golfers.

The top women's score was turned in by Lisa Hartley, of Clearwater, with an 81, to win the 70-74 age group gold medal. Hartley, who also had the women's longest drive on Wednesday, has won gold medals in six of the last seven Florida Senior Games. Hartley's round featured seven pars and a birdie. While not playing a practice round at the Jacaranda Golf Course, Hartley had a virtual view of the course via Google Earth to prepare for the Games.

"The course played very well, and the greens were true," Hartley said. "The shots on the green rolled very nice and I won the Longest Drive contest by about three feet."

The 36-hole competition featured a continuation of competition between two of Florida's top Senior Games golfers in the 60-64 age group, Martin Black, of Clearwater and Broward Sapp, of Crawfordville. Black finished two strokes ahead of Sapp at the 2019 National Senior Games and Sapp won the 2018 Florida Senior Games gold medal by a tiebreaker.

In the first 18 rounds, Sapp shot an 80, one stroke ahead of Black's 81. Not too far behind in the age group is Greg Jones, of Tallahassee, and David Hodges, of Jacksonville, both with a score of 83.

"Today, we learned the course in order to have a better round tomorrow," said Broward Sapp. "We figured out where to hit and where not to hit the ball."

In the 80-84 age group, William E. Jones, of The Villages, William McCullough, of Nokomis, and Gary Pearson, of The Villages, all finished with scores equivalent or lower than their age. The 83-year old Jones was two strokes ahead of his age with an 81, as was 82-year old McCullough, who shot an 80.

Pearson, 80, equaled his age and he and McCullough lead the age group after one day of play with Jones, a stroke behind.

Derrick Terrell, who leads the Men's 50-54 age group in the 36-hole event after day one, was the Men's Longest Drive winner. George E. Ringham, who won the 18-hole gold medal in the 85-89 age group, was the Men's Closest to the Pin winner and Kathleen Brown, playing in the 36-hole, 65-69 age group, was the Women's Closest to the Pin winner.

On the tennis court, the final day of play for Men's and Women's Singles competition was temporarily halted by a downpour and then moved from the Cypress Park Tennis Center to the Tennis Center of Coral Springs. After an hour-and-a-half lightning delay also delayed matches at the alternate locations, players returned to the court to wrap up their tournament play.

In the lone women's final of the afternoon, Martha Poitevent, of St. Augustine, captured the gold medal in the 70-74 division with a 6-4, 6-1 results against Joanne Collier, of Mulberry. The two will switch being opponents and foes to being teammates and friends starting Thursday as they team up for doubles action.

The final three brackets of men's singles saw champions crowned in the 60-64, 75-79, and 80-84 age groups. Jim Norfolk, of Kissimmee, worked his way to the 60-64 gold medal with wins over Steven Boshears (6-4, 6-1) and Jeffrey Nykerk (3-6, 6-2, 10-7). In the 75-79 division, Jonathan Bortner, formerly of Valrico, stood on top of the podium with a 6-0, 6-1 victory in the championship match against Rao. Earl Maslin, of Sebring, outlasted Russell Cumbie, of Carrabelle, to win gold in the 80-84 age group. The two split the first two sets 3-6, 6-4, having to end the match in a 10-point tiebreaker where Maslin won with a 10-4 showing.

Day seven of the 10-day competition sees the third day of the six-day Tennis championships that carry through Sunday, December 15. Thursday and Friday will be the men's and women's doubles competition while mixed doubles take place Saturday and Sunday. At Jacaranda Golf Club, golfers will tee off for the final time of the 2019 Games as the second day of the 36-hole tournament closes out its competition. The Games also welcome the start of the three-day Pickleball championships that run through Saturday.

Running the 5K Vistas at Vista View Park

Lakeland's Tri Thornberg began his Saturday morning, of December 7, at the 2019 Florida Senior Games with an effortless 5K run in just under 18 minutes. He was the top overall finisher at Vista View Park and won the gold medal in the 50-54 age group. Thornberg led for the majority of the race and topped the second-place finisher, Thomas Hampton by 40 seconds.

Longevity on the Archery Range

Archer Anna Hartman established herself as an age group record holder in three age groups during Saturday's Barebow Recurve competition. Hartman, from The Villages holds the record in the event in the 75-79, 80-84 and 85-89 age groups. Her score of 558 in the Barebow Recurve event of 2014 is the all-time high women's score.

More than a Decade of Swimming Records

Going one step beyond Hartman's longevity on the archery range, is Winter Haven's Brian Voisard, in the swimming pool. Voisard etched his name in the record book in a fourth age group setting the 65-69 record in the 200-yard backstroke. He holds the 500-yard freestyle records in the 50-54, 55-59 and 60-64 age groups, with the 50-54 record dating back to 2005.

A Marriage Made in the Pool

Debbie Cavanaugh, of Fort Lauderdale, set three 65-69 age group records in her first Florida Senior Games competition and joined her husband, Cav, in the FSG Record Book as the first husband and wife duo to set top marks. Cav set the 50 and 100-yard freestyle records in the 2000 Florida Senior Games and returned for the first time since this year. In his return, he established a new 100-yard freestyle mark in the 80-84 age group. Both Cav and Debbie have a long history of swimming dating back to their college years. Cav was an All American at West Virginia University in the late 1950s and Debbie was a standout member of the University of Miami team in the 1970s and is currently a champion Master's Swimmer.

Eagle Eye James Harden

Ocala Archer James Harden sees a lot of yellow on the range. His score of 885, of a possible 900, in the Compound Release event set a new record in the 55-59 age group. Harden is one of only two Florida

Senior Games archers to achieve a score higher than 880 and he has done it twice. He set the all-time high Compound Release mark of 891 in 2011. Of his 90 shots, at Fort Lauderdale Archers, from 40, 50 and 60 yards, 36 ended up in the X-ring, which measures five inches in diameter.

A Bowler's Excellent Weekend on the Lanes

Ed Fenstermacher, of Summerfield, had a good weekend at Strikers Family Sports Complex winning three Bowling gold medals in three different age group. In earning the three gold medals, he knocked down 2,016 points in nine games. On Sunday, Fenstermacher won the Men's Singles 75-79 age group gold medal with a three-game score of 638. On Saturday, he teamed with Gerald Teel to win the 70-74 Men's Doubles gold medal and set an age group record. He also teamed with Barb Johnson, of The Villages, to win the 50-54 Mixed Doubles gold medal, contributing a score of 651. His three-game total, of 727, in Men's Doubles was the highest of the weekend of all events and in eight of his nine games of the weekend, he topped a score of 200 or more. His top single-game score, of 257, came in the first game of Men's Doubles competition.

Shirley's 500-Yard Swim

In the longest swimming event of the schedule the 500-Yard Freestyle, only 15 women registered for the grueling event. Among those 15 was the most experienced swimmer registered, 94-year old Shirley Chase, of St. Augustine, who completed the 20 times back and forth in the 25-yard short course pool in 22 minutes. After learning of her time, Shirley disappointedly said, "I wanted to beat my own record." Chase set the 90-94 age group record in the 500 freestyle in 2015, when she was 90. Her caretaker, Mary Converse, reminded her that was four years ago and if she returns in 2020, she can set the 95-99 age group record.

Called out by The Mayor

At an Opening Day Ribbon Cutting Ceremony at the Lauderdale Lakes Multi-Purpose Center, Mayor Hazelle Rogers asked crowd members if there was anyone in attendance 85 years or old. Eulalee Bax quickly responded she was 89 years old and received a gold medal from Mayor Rogers. Bax was so motivated by the recognition, she registered to play Dominoes, where she was honored as the oldest and wisest female competitor.

27 and Counting

John Shultz, of Lakeland, extended his Florida Senior Games Table Tennis consecutive medal-winning years streak to 27 years, with a pair of gold medals, at the Broward Table Tennis Club on Tuesday. Shultz, who won the first medal of the streak in 1993, added the 2019 Men's Singles and Doubles 80-84 age group gold medals to his collection. He teamed with Deane Chickering, of The Villages, to win the Men's Doubles 80-84 age group. Chickering, who turned 85 this year, won the gold medal in the Men's Singles 85-89 age group.

Rains don't slow 2019 Florida Senior Games

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. – What started out as a torrential down pour early Thursday morning, at the 2019 Florida Senior Games presented by Humana, shifted to a clear, sunny finish in the afternoon. While the opening rounds of the men's and women's doubles championships at Tennis were canceled with flooded courts and soggy conditions, the 36-hole golf championship concluded as the first day of pickleball took place indoors at the DS SportPlex in Deerfield Beach.

Despite the not so favorable conditions at the Jacaranda Golf Course, after off and on rain from Wednesday afternoon through Thursday morning, Florida Senior Games golfers were still able to post scores to set 36-hole records.

Nick Kent, of The Villages, had the lowest overall 36-hole score with a 157, to set the 75-79 age group record and win the gold medal. He finished six strokes ahead of the silver medalist, Peter Konowicz, of Valrico, and topped the previous record by two strokes. Kent also holds the 70-74 age group record in 36-hole competition.

Due to the weather, the shotgun start time was pushed back 30 minutes. As the golfers progressed on the course, the weather cleared up as did Kent's second round, en route to an 18-hole score of 79. He finished Wednesday's round with a 78.

"I was five over par on the first nine holes and then the weather started clearing up," Kent said. "With the better weather, I was only two over par on the last nine. I stayed away from the big numbers and didn't have a score over five on any of the holes."

Also setting a 36-hole 80-84 age group record was William Jones, Jr., of The Villages, with a two-day score of 161. He bested his own record score of 163, set in 2016, and was one stroke ahead of the silver medalist, William McCullough, of Nokomis. Finally, the most experienced golfer in the field, 90-year old Dick Cheney, of Winter Haven, set a new 90-94 age group score with a two-day total of 208.

The top two-day score of the women's field was turned in by Sheryl Fleming, of Orlando, who won the 60-64 age group with a 179, an 85 on day one and 94 on day two.

On the first day of Pickleball at the DS Sports Plex in Men's Singles and Women's Doubles events, Bobbi Little, of North Fort Myers, and Diane Bock, of The Villages, won their fifth gold medal in seven years winning the 60-64 age group. Little and Bock defeated Pat Sargeant and Jodi Yambor, of Tallahassee, 11-4, 11-7 in the championship match.

Gabriel Wong, of the Ponte Vedra Beach, won his third consecutive gold medal in the Men's Singles 70-74 age group, defeating Julian Gershaw, of Delray Beach, 11-1, 11-6 in the final. Wong also won a Men's Singles Tennis gold medal on Tuesday in the 70-74 group.

Day eight of the 10-day competition sees the fourth day of the six-day Tennis championships that carry through Sunday, December 15. Friday will host both men's and women's doubles competition while

mixed doubles take place Saturday and Sunday. The Games will then continue with the second day of pickleball and will start billiards, hosting the nine-ball competition.

Veteran FSG Pickleball Player makes way through Bracket defeating younger competition for Gold

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. – Being the only entry in the 80-84 age group of Women's Singles Pickleball competition Jean Kiker, of The Villages, was guaranteed to add a 2019 Florida Senior Games presented by Humana gold medal to her collection. But, that wasn't good enough for the veteran Senior Games athlete.

Kiker played in a six-player bracket, with five players in younger age groups. She spent the morning at the DS Sports Plex going undefeated in four matches. She defeated the 70-74 age group gold medalist, Deb Dorne, of Boynton Beach, twice, and the 75-79 age group gold medalist Mary Turpin, of Silver Springs, and one other player in the 70-74 age group.

Both of the matches between Kiker and Dorne went to three-game sets and four of the games were decided by 11-9 scores. It was Kiker's 12th gold medal in Florida Senior Games Women's Singles, since 2005, while playing in four different age groups.

"She's very good," said Florida Senior Games Pickleball Sport Director Sindee Snow. "I know the matches against Deb Dorne were a challenge, but she won. I'm not surprised."

Kiker returns on Saturday to play Mixed Doubles with Richard Sharpe, of Delray Beach.

It's been a long couple of days on the court for Tobias Kaye, of Boca Raton, winning 65-69 age group silver medals in Men's Singles and Men's Doubles Pickleball. Kaye and his partner, Greg Hilligoss, of Lake Worth, were two of the last four players on the courts Friday evening after coming up short in a three-game match against David Bene and Terrence Billington, of Hernando.

His silver medal came after four Men's Singles matches on Thursday, giving him a total of nine matches in two days. He's also scheduled to play Racquetball on Saturday in all three events, Men's Singles and Doubles and Mixed Doubles in the 65-69 age group. He and his Men's Doubles partner, Gerald Goebel, of Jensen Beach, won a silver medal at the 2019 National Senior Games.

"It's been exhausting," Kaye said after receiving his Men's Doubles medal.

The 2017 Florida Senior Games Athlete of the Year, Mike Welter, from Cape Coral, continued his comeback after suffering a stroke in September 2018. The stroke initially paralyzed the left side of his body and his sight is still limited in his left eye. He teamed with Rick Colling, from Fort Myers, to win a bronze medal in the Men's Doubles 65-69 age group. The duo won the first two matches before dropping the last two.

Welter's original doubles partner, Doug McClintock, of St. Augustine, fell ill and was unable to make the trip to the Games. Colling stepped in at the last minute and made the across state trip to serve as a replacement. Welter returns to the court Saturday in Mixed Doubles with his partner, Bobbi Little, who teamed with Diane Bock to win the Women's Doubles 60-64 age group gold medal on Thursday.

"I'm still on the comeback trail," Welter said. "But I'm here."

At Beyond Billiards in Davie, stokers took to the tables for nine-ball competition, cueing up for accurate shots off the boards and into the pockets. In the most contested bracket, the men's 70-74 age group, James Decesare, of Pembroke Pines, took home the gold medal, winning all four of his matches. Decesare edged foe Philip Panzera, of Ocala, who went 3-1 on the day, losing only in the championship match.

Janis Sessions was the lone victor on the female side of the competition as the North Miami Beach native won gold in the 65-69 age group.

Overnight storms, once again, delayed tennis on Friday, pushing doubles play to a 10 a.m. start. As the courts dried, the action began to pick up, seeing duos face off for the doubles crown. Harry Liedke, of Ormond Beach, and Larry Restieri, of Palm Coast, worked through the men's 65-69 bracket to capture the age group championships.

To win the gold, Liedke and Restieri blanked opponent Oscar Sanchez & Robert Goldstein with a 6-0, 6-0 showing. Prior to the gold medal match, the dynamic duo secured a spot in the final with a 6-0, 7-5 results against Steven Nelson & Bruce Caton.

Final Weekend of 2019 Florida Senior Games Opens with Multiple Record-Setting Performances

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. – Dating back to its origins as the original Olympic sport, the Track & Field competition fielded the 2019 Florida Senior Games presented by Humana's largest registrant and participant field as 226 athletes signed up to compete in a total of 671 events over the two-day stretch at the Ansin Sports Complex in Miramar.

Field events, ranging from javelin, shot put, discus, long jump, pole vault, triple jump, and high jump, took center stage between the oval lanes on Saturday where three athletes stole the spotlight.

Before being recognized and honored with the 2018 Florida Senior Games Male Athlete of the Year on Sunday, Brian Hankerson, of Hollywood, posted a record-setting day as his gold medal performances in the high jump (5' 5.75"), triple jump (34' 5.39") and long jump (17' 8.99") all set the record in the 60-64. Saturday's victory of the triple crown of jumping events raises the bar as Hankerson now holds the age group records in 50-54, 55-59, and 60-64 in each of the jumping disciplines.

"I'm excited to be here and compete," said Hankerson, who was originally slated for four running events on Sunday. "I am thankful for this honor and recognition. My grandson's christening is tomorrow and subsequently, I'm withdrawing from the 50- and 100-meter races to attend the service." Hankerson, who will be honored at 9 a.m. on the track at Ansin, will return in the afternoon after his grandson's christening to compete in the 200- and 400-meter competitions.

Avis Vaught, of The Villages, is back on the track after recovering from major shoulder surgery in June. Four events later, Vaught, who was released this week by her doctor to compete, tallied three golds and a silver in her return. Vaught, who served as the FSG softball sport director this past August, won the discus (59' 5.78"), javelin (68' 0.93"), and shot put (22' 10.41") in the 70-74 age group while collecting the silver in triple jump (17' 9.78").

Finally, Stuart Spangenberg, of Melbourne, channeled his inner Jan Železný, current world record holder in the javelin at 98.48 meters, and launched the furthest spear, 161' 9.73", to win the gold in the 60-64 age group.

The gold-medal winning Shuffleboard team of Michael Zellner, of Holiday and Jim Allen, of Seminole, are not just players on the court but ambassadors and entrepreneurs for the game off the court.

"They're a prestige team," said FSG Shuffleboard State Director, Glenn Monroe, of the gold-medal winning team in the 60-64 age group at the Hollywood Shuffleboard Club.

Meaning they are respected and admired for their achievements and quality.

After Zellner retired from the Air Force where he was a communications and crew member on Air Force One and other U.S. Government executive level flights, he moved to Brazil. For a year he worked at the U.S. Embassy and moved on to become a professor at the University of Sao Paulo teaching English as a second language.

In his spare time, between 1993 and 2015, he introduced shuffleboard to Brazilians and over the course of 16 years, put together a national team that traveled to international tournaments. Zellner proudly claimed the team's highest finish was a silver medal at a competition in Canada in 1997.

Also, during his time in Brazil, he became the President of the International Shuffleboard Association, serving from 2010-16.

Teaming with Zellner was Jim Allen, who manages Allen R Shuffleboard, a premier manufacturer of Shuffleboard equipment, based in Seminole, that has been in his family since 1941. The company, started by his grandfather, supplies shuffleboard cues and discs among other things to players around the country.

"I'm looking around here today and can say I made most of these cues people are using," he said during a doubles match with Zellner.

In just two years, Hope Powers, of Pompano Beach, has gone from a beginning Powerlifter to a USAPL State Record Holder. Powers set records in the Squat and Deadlift, while establishing a personal best in the Bench Press at the Vernon Hargay Youth Enrichment Center, in Miramar.

Her record-setting deadlift of 352 pounds was a follow up of a disqualified lift at a recent meet.

"I had a little hitch in my lift," Powers said. "I got it up fine but just had a that hitch. I knew I could do it but just had to come out and make it happen today."

Her record setting and personal best lifts earned her the 2019 Florida Senior Games Best Female Powerlifter Award and Bench and Deadlift Champion Awards.

The Best Male Powerlifter Award went to Mosbeh Elkanany, from Coral Gables, the Bench Press Champion was Darian Bryant, of Sunrise, and the Deadlift Champion was Kirk Carver, from The Villages.

Erica Gonzalez, of Poinciana, won her third Pickleball gold medal on the third and final day of competition at the DS Sports Plex. She teamed with Scott Austin, of Hanover, PA, to win the 50-54 age group Mixed Doubles. On Thursday, she won the Women's Singles gold and teamed with Jana Spanos, of The Villages, to win the Women's Doubles gold medal.

Sylvia Whitehouse, of Palm Coast, teamed to win the Mixed Doubles gold medal with Brad Redmond, in the 55-59 age group. It was Whitehouse's eighth doubles gold medal (Women's and Mixed Combined) since 2018. She and Redmond won all four matches in straight sets with no opponents scoring more than seven points. Whitehouse was also a Women's Doubles gold medalist at the 2019 National Senior Games, teaming with Jana Spanos.

One of three athletes in the 95-99 age group at the 2019 Games, Herschel Sotzsky, of Pembroke Pines, was in action today winning a Billiards gold medal at Beyond Billiards. As the only athlete in the age group, he played one match and won a best of three match in two games, against Irwin Klar, an 89-year old from Deerfield Beach. The two other 95-99 age group athletes will, Mary Kemp, of Boca Raton, and James Bell, of Sebastian, are competing in the running events of the Track and Field meet on Sunday. Phil Panzera, of Ocala, won his third consecutive Men's Singles Eight Ball competition gold medal in the 70-74 age group. He won the 65-69 gold medal in 2017 and 2018.

Tobias Kaye was back on the court with a different kind of racquetball on Saturday, playing Men's Singles Racquetball at the David Posnack Jewish Community Center. He played nine pickleball matches on Thursday and Friday winning silver medals in the 65-69 age group in Men's Singles and Doubles. He added three racquetball matches to his total on Saturday for 12 over the last three days.

Kaye advanced out of pool play to the championship bracket and just missed a trip to the finals, losing to his doubles partner George Goebel.

Kaye and Goebel will team together in the Men's Doubles 65-69 age group on Sunday and he will team with Arlynn Abramson in Mixed Doubles.

Garland Reynolds, of Frostproof, added two more medals to his total for the week, winning the Free Throw Shooting and Spot Field Goal Shooting events in the 65-69 age group at the DS Sports Plex. Reynolds hit 27 of 30 free throws and hit 9 of 15 shots from various locations on the court for the Spot Shooting Gold.

He also won the 65-69 age group bronze medal in the 36-hole golf competition with a two-day score of 169, an 83 on day one and an 86 on day two.

Among the Women's Basketball Shooters, Trish LeGros, of Longwood, hit 27 of 30 free throws for the top overall performance and win the 60-64 age group gold medal. Alan Wells, of Orlando, established two new records, circling the track, in the 800 and 1500 meter runs in the 55-59 age group. In the 800-meter run, his time of 2:15.90, topped his own mark, set in 2018, by two seconds.

While heading toward the finish line, for his 1500-meter record-setting time, Wells clipped the railing with his left foot and nearly stumbled. He was able to recover and posted a time of 4:53.60, more than five seconds better than the previous record, set in 1994.

"I was so focused on the finish line and looking at the clock to see where I was in breaking the record, I hit the railing," Wells said. "Wearing the metal spike, you usually slip on the metal rail. I was lucky I didn't fall."

Wells, a former top-ranked 5K Road Race runner in Masters Track and Field rankings, turned to running on the track in the Florida Senior Games, and now holds the 800- and 1500- meter run records in the 50-54 and 55-59 age groups.

While Wells may have been the record-setter of the day, the celebrity of the meet Sunday was 97-year old Mary Kemp, formerly of Boca Raton, who ran the 50, 100 and 200 meter dash and was the anchor of a 4x100 relay team.

Area athletes win big at state competition

The 2019 Florida Senior Games wrapped up Sunday, but not before athletes from The Villages and surrounding areas hauled in hundreds of medals. Local competitors snagged 350 medals during this year's competition in the Fort Lauderdale area, according to available results provided by the Florida

Sports Foundation. The annual event featured more than 20 sports, including pickleball, track and field and swimming, and involved participants from around the state competing in their respective age groups. More than 180 of these athletes represented The Villages and nearby communities, with many of them departing the state event with a medal — if not handfuls of them — in their possession.

“The biggest thing I think that came out of the athletes that I saw from The Villages/Lake County area was more so, not just all the wonderful medals that they won, but just their passion overall for competing and wanting to be there and supporting each other during the process,” said Jason Hendrix, director of communications for the Florida Sports Foundation. “You could not help but see the white lettering that says The Villages in front of their green jerseys and stuff. It was really cool to have that. They came out, they supported, they showed pride and they did a good job.”

In track and field, local athletes collected more than 40 medals over the course of Saturday and Sunday at Ansin Sports Complex in Miramar. Among these medal winners was Village of Belvedere resident Avis Vaught, who captured four track and field medals — gold in the javelin throw (68 feet, 1 inch), discus throw (59-6) and shot put (22-10 1/2), and a silver in the triple jump (17-10) as a competitor in the women’s 70-74 age group — just six months removed from undergoing a repair to her left shoulder.

“Just being cleared last week from the doctor and going to compete this past weekend was muscle memory,” joked Vaught, a regular at senior games competitions. “The scores were comparable to what I can do, but it was very surprising to see how well I had done, considering that there has been no training since May 1. I’m excited — I’ve got a starting point. Next year, I will have all year to train and get back on track.”

Vaught also won volleyball gold medals in South Florida as a member of the Twisted Sisters (women’s 55+ division) and the Diamonds (women’s 70+).

Along with Vaught, Villages residents Diane Bock and Cheng Hung earned at least one medal in multiple sports at the state level.

Bock not only won three gold medals in pickleball (women’s 65-69 singles; women’s 60-64 doubles with Bobbi Little; and 60-64 mixed doubles with Paul Hudanich), but achieved bronze in the women’s 50-meter dash (9.52 seconds) in track and field.

“It was a very fun tournament, not because of the gold medals — it was the opponents that we faced, new people that we’ve never met and just the good sportsmanship that we experienced,” said Bock, of the Village of Mallory Square. “The whole experience was very, very, very fun, and I had great partners.”

Hung, 85, took gold in men’s 85-89 pickleball doubles with partner James Ferrel, as well as a gold in men’s 85-89 pickleball singles and a gold in men’s 85-89 tennis singles.

“I was able to run a little bit more than the other guys. That’s what put me ahead — that’s one real clear reason,” said Hung, of the Village of Chatham. “I was able to chase the ball better than them.”

In similar fashion, Mike Rusaw had success tracking down the ball in table tennis en route to three medals — gold in 70-74 mixed doubles with Deb Harrison; gold in men’s 70-74 doubles with Alan Millett; and silver in men’s 75-79 singles. While playing mixed doubles, Rusaw faced Millett and another familiar face — Peggy Rusaw.

“It was kind of different playing against your wife in the competition — and it took five games to (win),” said Mike, of the Village of Lynnhaven. “We were laughing about it, and when she hit a shot by me, they said I was going to have her walk home. It was a lot of fun.”

Mike was one of more than 10 members from The Villages Table Tennis Club to snag at least one medal. Harrison and Deane Chickering even won gold medals in singles, doubles and mixed doubles.

“When we first started the club and everything else, we didn’t think it would grow to what it is,” said Chickering, of the Village of Bonnybrook. “And we have got some great players, really.”

Great athletes and great performances also made their presence known at the pool and at the bowling lanes at the 2019 games, courtesy of swimmers Jeanne Hackett, Nate Leech and bowler Ed Fenstermacher.

Both Hackett, of the Village of Glenbrook, and Leech attained six gold medals through individual events and another two medals via relay events. Additionally, Leech achieved age-group records in five different races for the men’s 70-74 age group — 500-yard freestyle (6 minutes, 10.49 seconds), 200 backstroke (2:42.84), 200 butterfly (3:12.30), 200 individual medley (2:43.14) and the 400 individual medley (5:56.63).

“I didn’t think I would break five records, to be very honest,” said Leech, a Village of Winifred resident and regular triathlete participant. “I knew there were a couple of them that were very slow and that I could breeze through them — and I did. But a couple of the others, I was very surprised. I am happy overall, for sure.”

Meanwhile, Fenstermacher, 75, collected three gold medals in bowling — each in a different age group (men’s 75-79 singles; men’s 70-74 doubles with Gerald Teel; and 50-54 mixed doubles with Barb Johnson) — in addition to setting an age group record in men’s 70-74 doubles with Teel (1,396). Fenstermacher’s three-game total in men’s doubles (727) was the highest series recorded by any bowler in any of the bowling events, per a news release by the Florida Sports Foundation.

“That doesn’t happen that often where somebody actually gets a gold medal (in three different age groups), especially when you get down to 50 to 54,” said Fenstermacher, of Summerfield. “You go down there and, of course, you want to medal — you want to get something back — and the fact that I had a 727 series that was high for the whole tournament, both men and women, that meant something to me.”

Although this year’s Florida Senior Games was not a qualifier for the 2021 National Senior Games, which also will take place in the greater Fort Lauderdale area, the event afforded athletes an opportunity to experience the area. The 2020 Florida Senior Games also will be held there.

“We had some athletes who came down, who got to see some of the courses, some of the fields, some of the events and venues that we were looking to have during the qualifying year and gave us some great feedback on the things they loved, things that they saw as potential improvements, things of nature of competition,” Hendrix said. “It was a great preparation.”

For most sports, those who finish in the top four of their age division at the state games during a National Senior Games qualifying year qualify for the National Senior Games.

Villages golfer Adonica Aune, who took gold in the women’s 36-hole competition for the 70-74 age group (184), is hopeful she can experience the National Senior Games for the first time in 2021.

“Let’s put it on my bucket list,” said Aune, of the Village of Pennecamp. “And whether I achieve it or not, it’s a great challenge.”





“This event, together with the 400-yard individual medley, are events that people shy away from, both men and women, because they are the most difficult — technique-wise and distance-wise,” Winokur said, following his 200 butterfly win. “We had two women and three men in the 200-fly event, for example.”

“There was no record in my age group,” Winokur said, who set the 200-butterfly record and also broke a 19-year-old record in the 200-IM previously held by Paul Hutiger (St. Petersburg) when he went (3:18.41). The old mark was 3:18.63. “I had the record in the previous age group (70-74), but one of the guys just broke it. I might as well get the next one.”

Winokur, a swimmer for 35 years, also won the 100-fly (1:35.32), 200-back (3:14.19) and took third in the 500-free (8:09.33).

“I enjoy it,” he said. “This is pretty much what I have done since I retired 15 years ago. It keeps me busy, active, in good health and low blood pressure. I am in pretty good shape.”

Winokur said it was nice to have the event just a half hour away from home.







three.”


Admittedly, she is competitive. She said she was pleased with her butterfly event times — her specialty — and was also happy with her freestyle times.





Senior athletes from around Florida — and especially The Villages — are gearing up to win medals, share laughs and enjoy top-tier competition this month in the greater Fort Lauderdale area.

The 2019 Florida Senior Games begin Friday and will continue through Dec. 15 in South Florida, where athletes 50 and over will compete in more than 20 sports — such as archery, swimming and track and field — in their respective age groups. Approximately 1,600 athletes are expected to compete in this year's Games, according to the Florida Sports Foundation. Per usual, The Villages and its surrounding communities will be well represented in the total participation numbers, boasting more than 180 registered athletes ready to play on the state level.

“Our participants and competitors from The Villages always show up — they show up big, they show up strong, they show up competitive and they love it,” said Jason Hendrix, director of communications for the Florida Sports Foundation. “People consider Florida the retirement capital of the world. To me, I think The Villages is not the retirement capital of the world, I think it's the active capital of the world.”

Among the many individuals who embrace The Villages' active lifestyle is Gordon Weinblatt, a member of The Villages Table Tennis Club and registered athlete for the Florida Senior Games. Weinblatt will be one of many club members in action at the Broward Table Tennis Club.

"We're always excited for this," said Weinblatt, of the Village of Bridgeport at Lake Sumter, about the annual athletic event. "We play every week — almost every day — and this is our big way of competing. The Villages gets to compete against other people from around the state in a friendly competition."

Pickleball player Jana Spano, of the Haciendas of Mission Hills, is just days away from competing in her fourth Florida Senior Games.

"I think it's just state pride to really do the best I can for my state," said Spano, who will play in women's doubles, mixed doubles and women's singles. "It's like going to one big pickleball party and all your friends are there. And it's like, 'Let's get this party started,' and you play, and you watch them and you support them and then they play and they watch you and support you."

Villager Dave Van Nice said the quality of competition in archery in particular is excellent at the Florida Senior Games.

"It attracts very, very good shooters, and it's always good at least once a year to measure your skill level against some of the best in the state — and Florida has outstanding archers from anywhere in the country," said Van Nice, a Village of Duval resident and member of The Villages Archery Club. "(Floridians) do really well at nationals, typically."

This year, Van Nice will test his aim in the compound release event at Fort Lauderdale Archers.

"I've gotten progressively better where I'm just about at a, I'd say, at a competitive level," said Van Nice, who usually competes in the recurve event. "I'm in a very tough age group (men's 70-74), but I like the challenge that presents and the competition. And most of the people in my age group are here in The Villages, so I get to shoot against them quite often, week to week. I'm excited about the whole thing."

Bowler Carol Teel, the 2017 Florida Senior Games Female Athlete of the Year, said she always gets pumped for the state event.

"I've been out there practicing, working on my game, and hopefully I'll be on when I go down there," said Teel, of the Village of Amelia.

Goal-wise, Teel is hoping to win gold medals in all three of her scheduled events — women's doubles, mixed doubles and women's singles.

"It would mean a lot," Teel said. "There are better bowlers in it now, and it's not a gimme — I have to work for it."

Golfer Bill Jones, who earned a gold medal during the 2019 National Senior Games in New Mexico, said he sets his expectations high and just tries to follow his aim as best he can on the course. Jones will play in the 36-hole competition at Jacaranda Golf Club in Plantation as a member of the men's 80-84 group.

"This is a wild game. It'll humble you like no other game I've ever played," Jones said. "I go with the expectation of trying to play my best and I do, but where I end up, that's kind of a combination of what I do and what the other guys do."

For swimmer Trice Hirt, a Village of Bonita resident and winner of six gold medals at the 2019 National Senior Games, her focus in the pool is on how fast she finishes races.

"It really truly is never about medals for me. It's about my times," said Hirr, who will compete in six events at the Coral Springs Aquatic Complex. "It's been a while since I competed in the backstroke, so it'll be interesting. But it really is about my own performance, compared to what I've been doing."

Although this year's Florida Senior Games is not a qualifier for the 2021 National Senior Games in the Greater Fort Lauderdale Area, the event will give athletes an opportunity to experience the area prior to next year. The 2020 Florida Senior Games also will be held there.

"What we're trying to do in 2019 and 2020 is to kind of give Floridians and the local state kind of a heads-up and an advantage on the national level to have a birds-eye view/preview to not just the facilities, but the area, the great places to eat, the places to stay, the wonderful weather in South Florida in December — it's the 70s and 80s, when in other places in the country it's in the 30s and 40s," Hendrix said.

Peggy Peck, a Village of St. Charles resident and regular participant at the National Senior Games, is already embracing this National Senior Games preview in South Florida.

"I'm real excited about that, especially when you get to practice there this year and next year," said Peck, who will compete in basketball 3-on-3 and numerous track-and-field events at the 2019 Florida Senior Games. "That'll be a lot of fun."
