

Florida Senior Games Medal Winners at the 2022 National Senior Games

# Florida at the 2022 National Senior Games, presented by Humana May 10-23, 2022 – Greater Fort Lauderdale Area/Broward County

With the 2022 National Senior Games being held in Florida for the first time since 1999, it was no shock over 1,600 Florida Senior Games athletes registered to compete in their home state.

Those athletes compiled the highest medal total of all competing states with over 1,100 total medals awarded.

Besides representing the Sunshine State on the field of play, several athletes were involved in ceremonial events during the Games. Members of the Broward Heat Women's Basketball team and Track and Field athlete, Brian Hankerson were members of the Torch Run team at the Opening Ceremonies/Torch Lighting.

The Celebration of Athletes featured contributions from Track and Field Athletes Madelaine "Tiny" Cazel, who led the athletes in attendance in the Athletes Oath, and Joann Sampson, who was one of the State's flag bearers, along with bowler Lawrence Draeger. Hankerson, an ordained minister, delivered an opening prayer.

Florida athletes continue to make an impressive showing at the National Senior Games as over 8,600 Florida athletes have registered to compete in the National Senior Games since 2001.

# Clearwater Aces finally win gold.

This was a May the Clearwater Aces will long remember, winning two of the largest senior basketball tournaments in the U.S.

The Aces went undefeated in the 75+ division at the Masters Basketball Championships in Coral Springs May 2-7, defeating two teams that scored wins over the Aces at the Huntsman Games in October, 2021.

From May 15-19, the Aces won three pool play games, but lost to Code Blue from Alabama, 41-37. The Aces won the next two championship bracket games and met Code Blue in the championship game, winning 40-30. The 2022 National Senior Games gold medal is the first for the Clearwater Aces, after winning three silvers and three bronze medals since 2009.

Through it all were obstacles besides their opponents on the court.

"We had to properly deal with cases of COVID during the week in between," said Harry Carothers, a team mainstay through the years. "After the Coral Springs tournament, I was very sick and tested positive for COVID, as well as teammate Jim McNulty. I did my 5 days of quarantine at home and decided to go to National Senior Games, wear a mask, and stay away from people. Jim's case was very mild with no fever, and he decided to go too."

Besides the obstacles during the memorable month of May, Carothers underwent lumbar spinal fusion surgery in 2019, was out of action due to the pandemic in 2020, and had a total knee replacement in June 2021.

"Now that it has all worked out so well, we are feeling great," Carothers said.

## Stan Corwin wins 95-99 gold.

Boynton Beach's Stan Corwin was recognized as the oldest Male Florida athlete registered among the more than 1,600 competing in the 2022 National Senior Games. After hip replacement surgery, it was uncertain whether he would be able to compete.

When he walked into Sawgrass Lanes, on May 13, the Boynton Beach Bowler was greeted by his fellow athletes with great enthusiasm.

As one of two athletes in the Men's Singles 95-99 age group, Corwin won the gold medal with a three-game score of 397, defeating Merle Meeder by 73 pins.

Corwin is a Florida Senior Games Men's Singles record holder in the 95-99 age group and the Men's Doubles record holder in the 85-89, 90-94 and 95-99 age groups with Jack Appel, from Boca Raton.



# Kimberly Besuden four cycling gold medals in four events.

It took just over two hours of time on the bike for Kimberly Besuden, of Orlando, to win four gold medals at the 2022 National Senior Games. Besuden was one of only two women's cycling athletes to climb to the top of the medal stand in all four events of the 2022 National Senior Games.

Besuden won the 5K Time Trials gold medal with a time of 7:26, the 10K Time Trials finishing at 16:12, the 20K Road Race crossing the finish line in 33:14 and the 40K Road Race at 1:07:10.

# Deb Harrison wins three gold in Pickleball.

Another Florida athlete to complete the trifecta sweep in Pickleball was Deb Harrison, of The Villages. She won the Women's Singles gold in the 70-74 age group and followed up with a Women's Doubles gold with Ruth Weil, of The Villages, and a Mixed Doubles gold with Ted Meyer, of The Villages.

She also won a Women's Doubles Table Tennis gold medal teaming with Marilyn Cates, in the 70-74 age group.

Harrison is the most decorated Florida Senior Games Pickleball athlete in the 19-year history of Pickleball in the Games. Her continued excellence on the Pickleball courts earned her the 2018 Florida Senior Games Female Athlete of the Year.

## Power Walk and Table Tennis golds for Essie Faria



Essie Faria takes on every challenge in front of her, whether it be a 5K Power Walk Course, an opponent across the table tennis table, or a rear end collision on Interstate 95 that led to a three-year absence from the Florida Senior Games.

On her way home from the 2016 Florida Senior Games in Clearwater, Essie Faria's competition days in the Florida and National Senior Games almost came to an end.

After a stop to visit her daughter in Melbourne, Faria was almost to her North Miami home, after winning eight gold medals in track and field events and one more in the 1500 meter race walk, in the 80-84 age group.

In the Boynton Beach area, traveling 65 miles per hour, her car was rear ended on Interstate 95. She estimated the driver of the car that hit her must have been going 90 miles an hour.

On Wednesday morning, Faria, now living in Melbourne, was at the starting line for the 2022 National Senior Games, presented by Humana, 5K Power Walk, at the FLA Live Arena, about 40 miles from the site of her accident.

"It sounded like a bomb went off, an explosion," Faria recalled. "The guy who hit me was a military service veteran on the way to get some treatment in Miami. He was texting and not paying attention and hit me."

While Faria was extremely banged up after the accident, she refused to be transported to the hospital. While recovering on her own, she was encouraged to seek physical therapy to regain the strength that earned her the 2011 Florida Senior Games Female Athlete of the Year.

## Hugh Brotherton two Power Walk golds in 90-94 age group.

One of the most dramatic sites of the 2021 Florida Senior Games was watching a scraped and scarred Hugh Brotherton, of Englewood, circling the Ansin Sports Complex track for the 1500 Meter Power Walk, the day after a fall in the 5K Power Walk left him bruised and bloodied.

The efforts earned him a trip to the 2022 National Senior Games where he won a pair of gold medals in the 90-94 age group. Brotherton completed the 1500 meter Power Walk in 11:49, 47 second ahead of the second place finisher in the age group, fellow Floridian, Gus Ormrod, Sr., of Fort Myers. He crossed the finish line of the 5K in 43:15.50.

He settled for a silver medal in the 2021 Florida Senior Games 5K due to his fall, but claimed after the race, "I was ahead of the guy who finished first when I fell," speaking of Gus Ormrod, Sr.

## 80+ Year Old Florida Swimmers Show their Skills in the Pool

While Florida Swimmers tallied an impressive 177 medals overall, eight swimmers from Florida, between the ages of 80 and 96 won a total of 38 medals, 21.4% of all Florida medals earned.

Kudos to Andrew Miller, who won six medals (3 gold, 3 bronze), Sarah Shire, three gold medals and Mary Rose Rowan, winner of four medals (1 gold, 3 bronze), all from The Villages, in the 80-84 age group.



Martha Henderson, of Cocoa, was a five-time medalist (3 gold, 2 silver) and Pat Tullman, of Tampa, won five gold medals, both in the 85-89 age group. Tullman won six medals at the 2019 National Senior Games, five silvers and a bronze, swimming in the 80-84 age group and collected six medals at the 2015 Games, two golf and four silvers in the 85-79 age group.

Joan Campbell, of Palm Harbor (pictured at left with Martha Henderson seated on bleachers), who began swimming in the National Senior Games in 1989, as a Connecticut resident, won five gold medals in the 90-94 age group. Gordon Ralph, of The Villages, brought home six medals (3 gold, 3 silver), joining Campbell in the 90-94 age group.

Florida's most experienced swimmer, Shirley Chase, of St. Augustine, who at 96-years old, won four medals (3 gold, 1 silver), including a gold in the 500-yard freestyle

## Linda Fulton Masters the 70-74 age group at the National Senior Games

On Linda Fulton's Master's Swimming Achievements page, it lists 298 swims dating back to the 60-64 age group. In only one of the times off the starting blocks did she have a finish lower than fourth place. Other than a handful of fourth place finishes, the place column is filled with 1, 2 and 3.

She won six gold medals in her six events at the 2022 National Senior Games, swimming for the first time in the 70-74 age group. Of her six gold medal winning times, five set new all-time best marks in the 70-74 age group.

In her specialty event, the backstroke, she topped the previous mark in the 50, 100 and 200 yard backstroke, all by more than four seconds. Her time in the 200 backstroke was 16 seconds better than the previous record. Fulton also set new all-time best marks in the 50 yard freestyle and 50 yard butterfly, breaking the old mark, set by fellow Florida swimmer, Patrice Hirr.

In the 100 yard butterfly, the only event she did not set a new age group all-time best time, she only missed setting the new record by ½ second. Fulton holds six Florida Senior Games records in the 65-69 age group.

# TV Show Host or Swimmer – Pick the Day for Marc Middleton

While not promoting the health and fitness aspects of the National Senior Games during daily broadcast on the Growing Bolder media platform, he started with Bill Schaffer, Marc Middleton was backing it up in the swimming pool winning four gold medals.

The long and lean former sports director for WESH-TV in Orlando, now Growing Bolder host, didn't spend too much time in the pool swimming three 50-yard events and a 100-yard event. In the 50-yard freestyle, backstroke and butterfly, each of his gold medals came in 32 seconds or less.

In the 100-yard IM, he took the gold medal with a time of 1:08.26, finishing just ahead of follow Floridians, Hubie Kerns, of Fort Lauderdale, and Sarasota's Rudy Vazmina, the 2015 Florida Senior Games Male Athlete of the Year.

## Florida Senior Games Hubie Kerns hits the water in a different way at National Senior Games

Following a career as a stuntman appearing in over 300 movies and television shows, Hubie Kerns returned to the water as an athlete rather than the guy falling into the water from great heights.

While diving from the starting blocks in six events, Kerns, swimming in his home territory of Fort Lauderdale, won five gold medals and a silver. The only non-gold medal winning performance came n the 100 IM, where he followed Marc Middleton in touching the wall two seconds later and less than a second ahead of Sarasota's Rudy Vazmina.

Beginning in 1969, Kerns was in high performance car chases, flipped cars, fell from great heights into the water and did stunts for more than a few recognizable names.

His list of credited stunt work on IMDb.com includes 375 movies and television shows stretching from Beneath the Planet of the Apes in 1970 to recent Fast and Furious movies.

All of that was in the past at the 2022 National Senior Games as roamed around the pool deck comparing times, practice schedules and swapping swimming stories with fellow athletes from Florida, Texas and California.

# Roger Vergin Competes in Eight Track and Field Events and Brings Home Eight Medals

By winning eight track and field medals in the 85-89 age group. Roger Vergin can claim to be the most decorated Florida athlete of the 2022 National Senior Games.

However, it is when he left his feet where he found the most success. Of the eight medals he collected, he won four gold medals in the high jump, long jump, triple jump and pole vault. He won silver medals in the 50 and 200 meter dashes and the hammer throw while winning the 100 meter dash bronze medal.

Vergin set the Florida Senior Games Long Jump records in the 75-79 age group in 2013 and established the top mark in the 80-84 age group in 2017. He set the 80-84 Triple Jump record in 2018.

## Less than a Second Separated Florida Sprinters Andrea Collier and Sonder Hawkins

In the three sprint races of the 2022 National Senior Games, Orlando's Andrea Collier and Sonder Hawkins placed first and second, respectively, in all three races. Less than one second, combined, separated the gold and silver medal in those three races.

Here's a breakdown of the three races between Collier and Hawkins and the times of both.

#### 50 Meter Dash

7.33, Andrea Collier; 7.54, Sonder Hawkins. 21/100 of a second

#### 100 Meter Dash

13.40 Andrea Collier; 13.77 Sonder Hawkins, 37/100 of a second

#### 200 Meter Dash

27.90, Andrea Collier; 28.27, Sonder Hawkins, 37/100 of a second

Collier set 55-59 age group records at the 2021 Florida Senior Games in the 50 and 100 meter dashes. Her time of 7.37 in the 50 meter dash was an all-time best and her time in the 2022 National Senior Games topped the record-setting time of 2021.

# Florida Triple Jumpers Claim All Three Medals in the 60-64 Age Group

It was a Florida sweep on the medal stand for a trio of Triple Jumpers. Hollywood's Brian Hankerson (pictured below) won the gold, Chris Smith, of New Port Richey took the silver and Alfred Leon, of Clearwater, was the bronze medalist. All three athletes cleared 30 feet with their jumps. Hankerson's leap of 36 feet, one and ¼ inch, was the overall best of all triple jumpers.

Hankerson's 2022 performance was the top overall jump of the 60-64 age group. He also holds the top triple jump in the 55-59 age group and his leap of 41 feet, eight inches, in 2011, is the second overall best in the 50-54 age group. Only Hankerson and David Quick have cleared 40 feet in the National Senior Games.

Since 2009, Hankerson has set the Florida Senior Games triple jump records in the 50-54, 55-59 and 60-64 age groups. Hankerson and Alfred Leon were the gold and silver medalists at the 2021 Florida Senior Games.

# Tiny Cazel leaves her track spikes on the field at Ansin Sports Comples.

Madelaine "Tiny, Cazel, of The Villages, had some shocking news for her fellow athletes and friends at the 2021 Florida Senior Games, presented by Humana. This would be her final Florida Senior Games on the track.

"I don't want to train like I have been any longer," Cazel said. "I just want to play sports for fun. Play some golf and bowl."

She turned in qualifying performances last December and began her training for the 2022 National Games. Tiny takes her Senior Games competitions seriously. She sets goals for herself and many of those goals include setting state and national age group records.

She holds 13 Florida Senior Games records in the 70-74, 75-79 and 80-84 age groups. She set records in the 65-69 age group that have been broken since she left the age group.

Competing for the first time in the 85-89 age group this year, Cazel set records with a javelin throw of 58'2, breaking the previous record by 13 feet, and had a record-setting discus throw of 58'1, topping the previous record by 14 feet. Her long jump of 7'll, also established a new 85-89 age group mark.

She now holds seven total records in the discus, javelin and long jump from the 70-74 age group through the 85-89 age groups.

For her final performance on the track, Cazel won five gold medals and a silver. The field events is where she truly stands out and won gold medals in the discus throw, long jump, javelin and shot put. She also won the 50 meter dash and took a silver in the 100 meter dash.

She won her first National Senior Games gold medals in 2003 and has traveled to 10 National Senior Games during her career. All totaled, Cazel has won 29 gold medals and 43 National Senior Games medals.

"I can't pick up the box of medals I have in the closet any longer," she said.
